Dear Parents and Carers

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We have now completed four weeks of a new year, and a fresh start. With high attention to all of the organisation that has been required to get the school back on its feet following the turbulent course of events over 18 months, I feel we are in a good place to drive forward with all aspects of school development. You may know that we achieved a successful Ofsted outcome in January 2020, just before the pandemic struck. Although many actions have taken place since then, they have not been in line with all that we would have achieved under usual circumstances. Here is a brief overview of our school development plan for this year:

The curriculum is reviewed and further developed. In line with the Ofsted report in 2020, we want to review the progression of skills across subjects, such as geography and history. We will also look at how the revised Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum fits with that of Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Our curriculum enquiries will be reviewed, to ensure they are aligned with the needs and interests of the pupils.

The quality of teaching and learning is at least good. This is not to say that the quality of teaching and learning is not good, but due to the inaccessibility to monitoring activities and assessments, due to the pandemic, we want to ensure that all monitoring is in place to recognise good and outstanding practice and to support ongoing professional development.

The teaching of phonics and spelling is improved. We wish to further improve teaching and learning in both phonics and spelling, with a review of the policy and ongoing professional development. With this, we will consider any additional resources that will need to be purchased.

Maths initiatives are reviewed to present more challenge in pupils' learning. In line with the Ofsted report in 2020, we will review the use of interventions, associated policies and embed the revised scheme of work, so that all pupils are challenged in their learning.

Pupils will read widely and often, with fluency and comprehension. We very much promoted a love of reading prior to the pandemic and wish to ignite this again, to ensure it is a priority. With this, the Reading Policy, strategies and assessment will be reviewed, and necessary materials will be purchased.

IT hardware is upgraded. We want to improve our IT resources, with particular emphasis on increasing access to mobile devices and appropriate software.

The curriculum and wider opportunities promote a healthy lifestyle. We are keen to increase access to, and participation in, a wide range of extra-curricular activities, particularly as access has been so limited over the past 18 months. We will also access training in mental health for relevant staff and increase awareness of staff responsibilities regarding mental health. With this, additional support and resources will be implemented to support SEMH (Social, Emotional and Mental Health) needs. The statutory RSHE (Relationships, Sex and Health Education) Policy and scheme of work will be fully embedded, having been written and consulted on last year.

The school site is improved, with more play opportunities. If you have attended recent NPSA meetings, you will know that we wish to work together to raise funds to improve play equipment and areas around the site. We know this is a long term goal, but are keen to see what we can achieve this year. Lower school classes were redecorated last year and we now want to focus on redecoration of the upper school.

Thank you, Oscar

Oscar, in Year 3, sold some of his own toys and books. In doing this, he raised £7.88 and has chosen to donate it to the NPSA. Isn't this a kind, thoughtful and generous thing to do?
