Responsibilities at Newbridge Primary School

Throughout all years, the children are expected to take responsibility. For the younger children, these may not be specific roles, but more general in terms of keeping the classroom tidy or clearing their plate away after lunch. The older the children get, the more responsibilities they will have opportunity to fulfil. In Year 2, for example, children can be Play Leaders, supporting happy playtimes for all children. You may know that children are elected as members of our Junior Leadership Team (JLT) - these children form a committee who help the staff think about, and action, how we can do things better as a school. Each class also has Class Ambassadors - these children are chosen to represent the class, specifically if a visitor is coming to school, to make sure they receive a warm and informed welcome. When our current Year 6 pupils were in Year 5, they were given the important role of acting as a buddy to a Year 2 pupil. These pupils are now in Year 6 and Year 3, and these buddy friendships have undoubtedly enabled the Year 3 children to transition successfully to the Upper School building. In Year 6, many more opportunities become available. There is quite a list, and this year the children applied for these roles, with the wish to be considered. The roles and responsibilities include helping in the school dining hall, setting up for an assembly and counting the house points. In Year 6, there are also Sports Captains and House Captains. These children are chosen to act as positive, pro-active and supportive role models.

They will be involved in representing their House, at events, or representing the school to visitors. Such responsibilities, across the whole school, provide the children with a sense of pride, they encourage confidence and allow for the children to develop skills through interactions with others. Every child has a responsibility, and it is encouraged, that the older they become, the more responsibility they can demonstrate. Without this, the school would not run as smoothly and others would not feel so supported. This fits with our school vision, that Newbridge Primary School pupils will be academically and socially confident and will take their next steps as caring, creative and healthy young people who will actively and responsibly make a difference to our world.





