Thank you again to everyone who joined these meetings on Tuesday evening. The teachers have completed the outstanding meetings from when the provider's site had an outage last week. I appreciate that a good deal of information is coming to you via email about new systems in school, however I do urge you to read this so that you feel fully informed and aware of how these systems operate.

### **Remote Learning**

You will know that we launched our remote learning platform on Wednesday. Whilst this was exciting, I still very much hope that this will not be needed. I am grateful to those who have already followed the PowerPoint, have logged in, have left a message for the class teacher and have started to complete the initial assignment. The teachers are promoting their Google Classroom with their children, as we do need all children to gain access. If you have not already set your child up, please can I ask that you do so this weekend. This way we will be able to understand if there are any problems.

To be prepared, today your child will have brought home two exercise books. Please keep these safe and for the purpose of remote learning in the event of your child having to learn from home.

### Attendance

Please can I remind all parents and carers that any absence must be reported to the school office by 9.30am and the reason for absence must be clearly stated. If we are unable to establish a reason for a pupil's absence, a letter will be immediately issued. Attendance matters at all times are of high importance, but at this time it is imperative that all procedures are supported and followed correctly.

#### Harvest

We would usually hold our Harvest Assembly celebration on the last day of this term. It is one of my favourite assemblies of the year. Coming from a farming family, I have fond memories of Harvest time and appreciate the hard work this entailed. At our assembly, we would usually display food items that had been donated and then package them up for a local charity. Although we cannot hold our Harvest celebration this year, we are keen to see if anyone would like to donate a non-perishable item that we could then donate to 'Weston and Newbridge Food Club'. This operates out of the Weston Hub in partnership with FareShare and is a scheme to support local families to access the food and groceries they need.

We would like to do this in conjunction with Emmanuel Church, which is also collecting donations.

If you would like to make a donation, we will have boxes at the Charmouth Road gate on Tuesday 20th and Wednesday 21st October. Ideally, items can be dropped off as the children enter school. Alternatively, please ring the buzzer during the day and we can collect them from you. You can also leave donations at the front door of Emmanuel Church, Apsley Road on Monday 19th October and Thursday 22nd October between 8am and 5.00pm.

Useful food items will include pasta, tinned fruit, tinned vegetables, rice, tinned soup, baked beans, pulses and cereals.

#### Attendance and symptoms of Covid-19

Please refer to the Public Health poster further in the newsletter which helps define symptoms of Covid-19 and those of a cold.

#### Symptoms of Covid-19 are:

A high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature);

A new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours; A loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal.





























# NPSA NEWS


Everyone who enters a pumpkin will get one free entry to the Autumn Trail (although please note that you do still have to book your Trail ticket, so that we can monitor numbers.)

## COVID-19 information A quick guide for parents and carers

Please follow the advice in this guide. Only contact the school if your child is having a test and to let us know the result. Your school will not be able to advise beyond the information given here. Please remember to only get tested if you have COVID-19 symptoms.

## YOU SHOULD BOOK A TEST IF YOUR CHILD HAS:

## a high temperature

**Or** a new continuous cough

**Or** a loss of or change to your sense of smell or taste

This means they feel hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure their temperature)

This means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough it may be worse thanusual)

This means they've noticed they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

**If your child DOES NOT have symptoms of COVID-19** but has other cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, they do not need to be tested and they or members of your household do not need to self-isolate. Your child can attend school if fit to do so.
