

Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you managed to have some time to relax and rest over the half term holiday; however I am sure the current restrictions will have come as a blow to everyone. Please know that as a school, we are determined to continue to do our best for all of our children and families, and to ensure that we deliver a curriculum that is as broad and enriched as possible. The children have returned to school well and of course we will continue to support them all, as appropriate, with the wider changes and making sense of these, if necessary.

On Wednesday evening I wrote to you to say that the new restrictions will have little impact on how we are operating as a school. The only points for parents and carers to note, are that Breakfast Club and After School Club should only be used for the purpose of work, to seek work, to attend education or training, or for the purposes of respite care for carers, and only when absolutely necessary. The guidance also stated that your household should only work together with one other household for the purpose of dropping off at school and for collection from school, if necessary. I have provided a link to the impact of the new restrictions on education and childcare settings further in the newsletter, along with the details of the current new restrictions.

Remembrance

Sadly, we will not be able to hold our whole school Remembrance Assembly on Wednesday, though we will hold a two minute silence at 11am. We will have poppies on sale in each class on Monday and Tuesday next week, if children would like to purchase one.

Punctuality and Attendance

Please note that all children are required to be in their classrooms by 8.55am and that all children are expected in school each day, unless there is an authorised reason for absence. It is the parent/carers' responsibility to phone the school on 01225 421675/421620 by 9.30am on the day to report pupil absence and it is vitally important that the reason for absence is shared. Letters will be issued to parents if a child is late on more than one occasion and if a reason for absence is not reported.

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Please note, that following the new restrictions, Breakfast Club and After School Club should only be used when absolutely necessary. It is imperative that all children are booked into the required sessions in advance to ensure staffing ratios are accurate.

Ventilation and additional layers

All doors, except fire doors, remain open to avoid use of door handles and windows remain open to increase ventilation in all spaces. Due to this, and with PE continuing outdoors, it is advised that all pupils wear additional layers.

Symptoms of Covid-19

Any pupil or adult displaying symptoms of Covid-19 is not permitted to enter the premises.

The most important symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough;
- a high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

If anyone has any of the symptoms above they, and household members, should self-isolate at home and request a test.

Testing positive for Covid-19

In the event of a pupil or staff member testing positive for Covid-19, the school will take swift action and liaise with the Department for Education and Public Health South West, and their guidance will be followed.

Please can parents/carers immediately report a positive Covid-19 test result for a family member or close contact, to the school. Again, advice surrounding this will be sought from Public Health South West.

Eligibility for Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of, or are currently applying for, any of the below listed benefits, your child(ren) may be entitled to free school meals. This is different to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receiving the government funded school meals. The qualifying benefits are: Income Support; Job Seekers Allowance; Employment Support Allowance; Child Tax Credit; Pension Credit; Working Tax Credit run-on; Asylum Seeker or Universal Credit. OUR YEAR 4 CHARITY WALKERS CELEBRATED IN THE NEWSPAPER

'We wanted to give hope to all the homeless'

Year 4 pupils from a school in Bath, Somerset have tackled a walking challenge to support people experiencing homelessness in the local area.

During half-term, eight young school friends in Year 4 at Newbridge Primary School took on a walking challenge to raise vital funds for local charity Julian House.

Over three consecutive days starting on the October 24, the girls clambered steep hills, traversed muddy paths and faced heavy rain to complete their 16-mile challenge and raise an incredible £1,775 for the Bath charity.

Inspired by a talk in class about the struggles faced by people experiencing homelessness, the young friends - Scarlett, Hattie, Mina, Amity, Mia, Lauren and Ursie - wanted to raise money to help.

Eight-year-old Mina said: "We wanted



to do the walk for Julian House because at school we have been learning about how hard it is to be homeless and what Julian House provides for them.

"I think every homeless person should at least have hope that they will find a home one day, and Julian House helps them achieve that dream."

Scarlett, aged 8, said: "We wanted to raise money for Julian House so that they can continue to help more homeless people in Bath."

The girls took on some tough routes

for their challenge which included a steep ascent to Bath racecourse and down to Primrose woods and a muddy circular course around Park, Rainbow Woods and Smallcombe Vale.

But despite having sore feet the girls remained in high spirits.

Nine-year-old Lauren said: "It was worth it to raise money for Julian House. I loved doing the walks and it has made me want to do more things for charity."

Amity, nine, said: "All you need to

achieve anything is sweets and friends!"

Jess, senior community and events fundraiser at Julian House, said: "These girls are an inspiration. To hear about the struggles of someone else and immediately want to do something to help just proves how compassionate and caring these young friends are.

"They've done such an incredible job, facing difficult weather and a tough challenge to raise a phenomenal amount. As we go into winter, their support and funds raised will be needed more than ever.

"Their money raised will help us provide essential life-saving care and support for very vulnerable men and women. At a time when such individuals face the double threat of Covid and plunging temperatures.

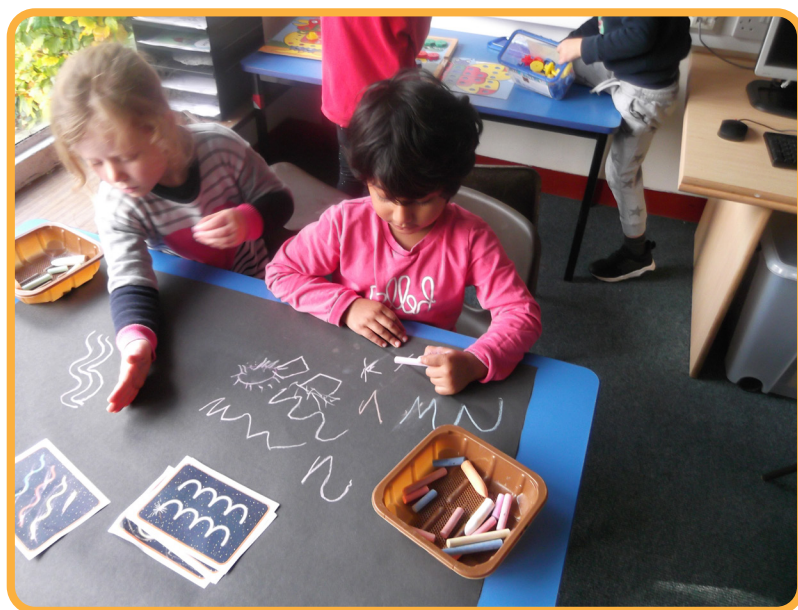


SCHOOL LIFE THIS WEEK

Year 3 getting active! In PE we have been long distance running around the field to raise our heart rate. We did our warm up with Mrs O’Gara.

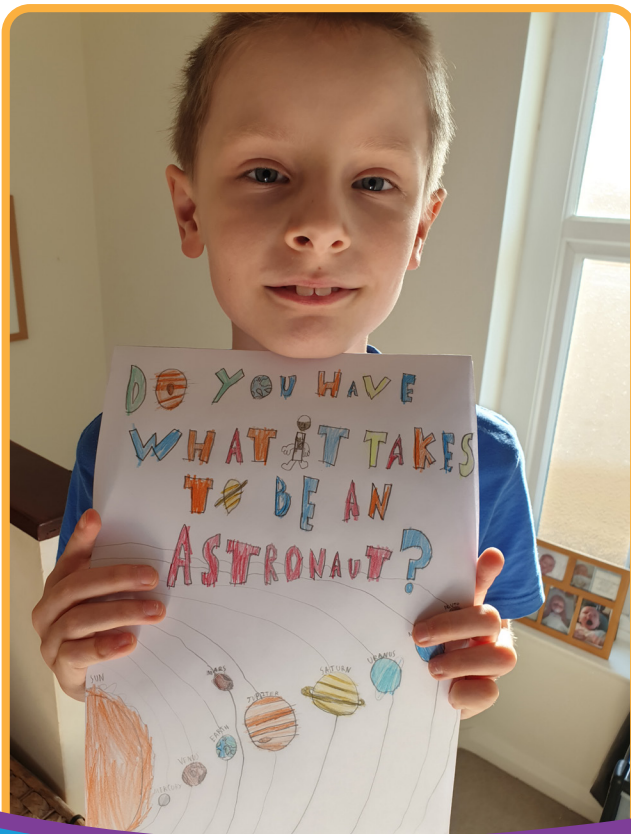

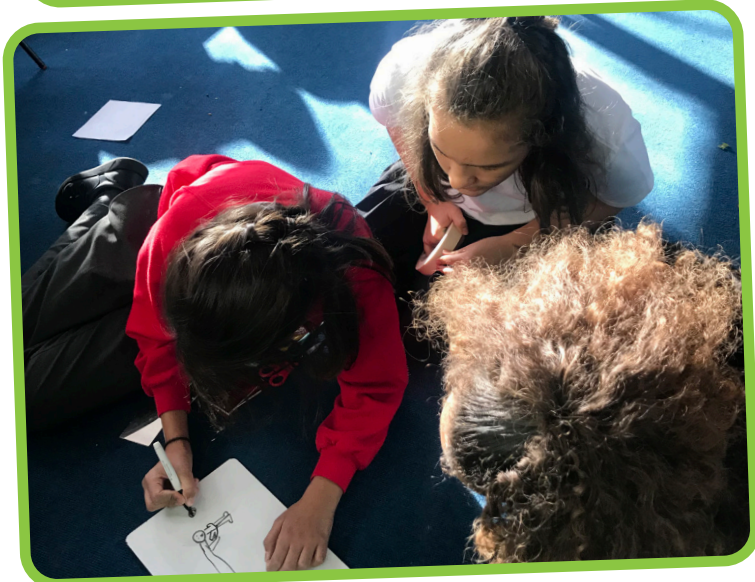




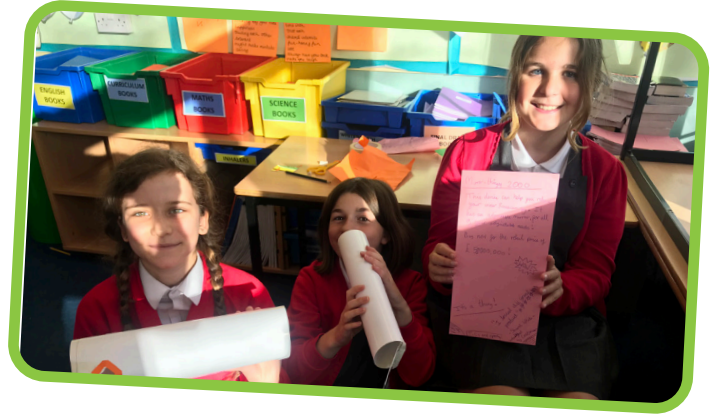
Year 5 had a brilliant time programming using algorithms this week and learning about space



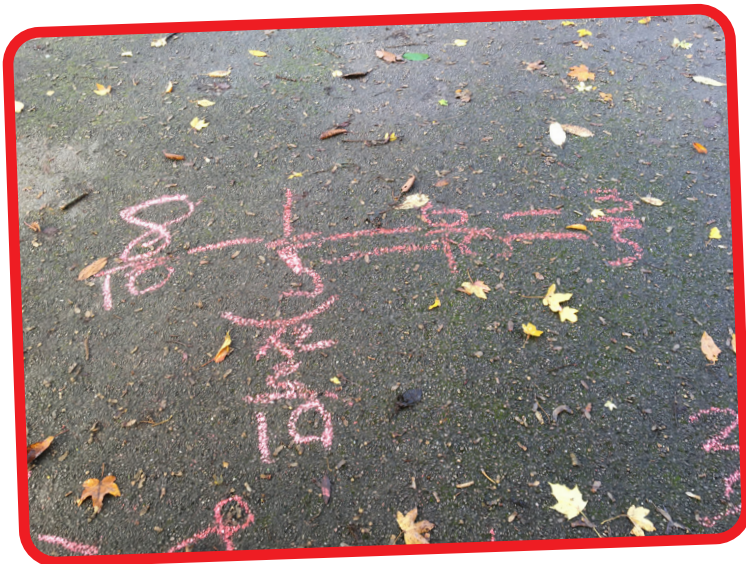
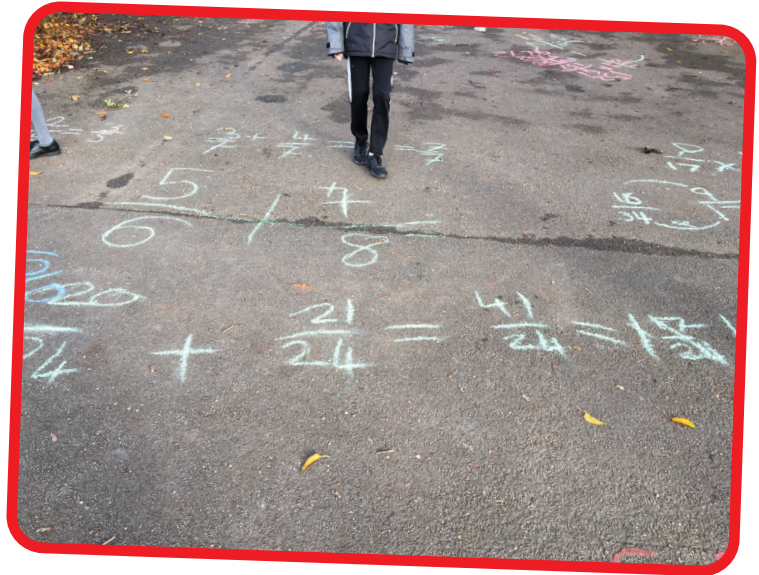
Year 6 have been investigating the fact that light travels in a straight line and that it can be reflected. They designed and made periscopes.



Finished periscopes!



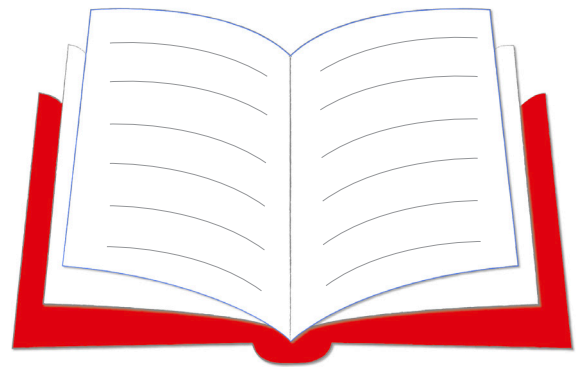

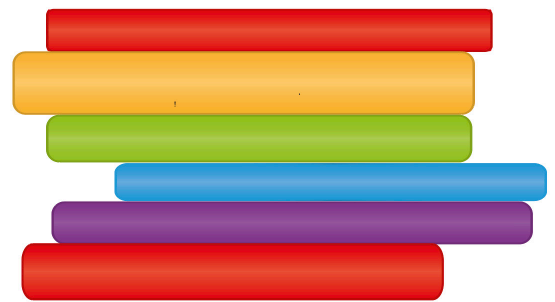
We love reading at Newbridge Primary School!

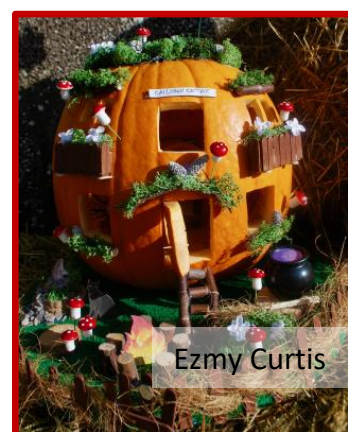
