This week, the children in Year 5 had so much fun – there was great excitement as they launched 'rockets' on the field at the start of their enquiry 'Have you got what it takes to be an astronaut?'. In Year 4, they are considering 'Does charity begin at home?' and this week Gavin Osborn, from Julian House, came to talk to the classes about the work of the charity, in supporting the homeless. For Advent, the children will organise a reverse advent calendar, bringing essential items to support this valuable charity.

Mental Health in Schools - by Alex Bacon, Mental Health Lead

We have been speaking with pupils in the Upper School about what happens to their brains and bodies at times of anxiety: the typical thoughts and feelings that may occur and how this could affect their actions.

We are using the term *flipping our lids* to describe how we can sometimes enter survival mode (fight, flight or freeze) at these times and react instinctively – almost without apparently thinking.

We have referenced Dan Siegal's *hand-model* of the *Triune Brain* as this helps explain the effect the production of cortisol has on higher-order thinking.

Using the hand to represent how the pre-frontal cortex is overridden by the *fight, flight or freeze* urge gives staff and pupils a relatively simple tool to refer to and understand.

We have made a movie featuring pupils, former-pupils, staff and parents talking about what it feels like at times when they have *flipped their lids*, with the emphasis on activities and strategies that may be helpful at these times. This will be referred to again at times throughout the year, and also shown to Lower School classes
