**Dear Parents and Carers** 

I hope you have had a good week. School life continues to be busy across the school please remember to check in to your child's Google Classroom Stream for a full update. If you are able to leave a comment, this would be great.

#### **Current measures**

In discussion with Public Health, it has been decided that we will maintain all current measures for a further week. Cases of Covid-19 are spread across the school which indicates now is not yet the time to commence more mixing.

This remains regrettable, however, the priority is to protect the education of all children. This will again be reviewed next week.

Extra- Curricular activities will operate in the same way next week, as they have done this week. If parents are able to cancel any Breakfast Club and After School bookings that are not essential, this will be greatly appreciated and a refund will be provided.

Therefore, these measures will be in place next week:

- School meals and packed lunches will be served in classrooms.
- Some extra-curricular activities will be halted please see table for this detail

- Parents are requested to wear a face covering when gathering at the school gate and must wear one when entering the school site.

We are not implementing any measures which will impact on the children's education.

Whilst children across the school are rehearsing for Christmas activities, at this stage we are not able to determine how these events may take place. We will provide updated information in due course.

Can I please ask all families to continue to be vigilant for symptoms of Covid-19 and to seek a PCR test when required. Please can all parents continue with twice weekly LFD testing to identify asymptomatic cases of Covid-19.

The applications were fantastic and I am very pleased that so many children wish to play an active part in shaping our school.



### Clerk to Governors – Required with Immediate Effect

Newbridge Primary School is seeking to appoint a Clerk to the Governors to commence duties with immediate effect.

The fee payable is £400 per term, £1,200 per annum and is based on:

- 5 Full Governing Body meetings per year
- 3 Premises meetings per year
- 3 Finance & Personnel meetings per year
- 3 Teaching, Learning & Leadership meetings per year

Meetings are generally held in the evenings between 5.30pm and 8.00pm. The Clerk will be expected to liaise with the Headteacher and the Chair of Governors/committees in order to set an appropriate agenda which, together with associated documents, need to be shared in good time with the relevant governing body members. They will then be required to take detailed, accurate minutes and get them typed up and distributed within two weeks of the meeting. Other than attendance at meetings, the role will be carried out at home at times to suit the Clerk, whilst ensuring agreed timelines are met. Currently, some meetings are held online. We are looking for someone who:

- Has experience as an administrator
- Is IT literate
- Is well organised
- Has good communication skills
- Is able to take accurate minutes at meetings
- Is able to maintain impartiality and handle confidential minutes
- Is capable of advising Governors of changes in legislation and other requirements
