Ongoing measures



YEAR 6 BATH BLITZ TRIP

On Tuesday 7th December, 6B went on a tour around Bath, learning about the Bath Blitz. We were guided by Adrian, who was very knowledgeable about the subject. He began with the Bath Abbey and told us that the eastern window was shattered by an incendiary box (fire bomb).

After a brief walk to the Roman Baths, Adrian explained that everyone was resourceful during the bombing of Bath, two Roman statues even lent a hand as a washing line for the citizens of Bath! The walls of the Roman Baths also played a key part as an ironing board for the women who washed the clothes.

Next, we approached Kingsmead Street. After the Bath Blitz, Adrian informed us, it was reduced to a pile of dust and rubble. He told us a sad tale about a woman who sent her children to a public air raid shelter but were found dead on the floor the next morning, killed by flying glass.

Later on, Adrian showed us a building not far from the Odeon that had shrapnel (flying metal) marks on its side. It had been a Labour Exchange before it had been badly damaged. We then walked to Queen Square where the Francis Hotel is. Adrian said that the left side of the hotel was blown to smithereens and sadly, two people died.

Did you know - Queen Square is actually a war memorial?

Finally, we visited a war memorial and paid our respects. 417 people died during the Bath Blitz but many more survived.
