Dear Parents and Carers

The whole school is sensing more normality this week. We have had assemblies across the school and lunch in the dining halls, which the children have coped very well with. It is nearly two years on from all of the turmoil of first closing this school, and this feels like a good place to be.

Supporting the Ukrainian Crisis We have planned how we would like to raise funds to donate to the Disasters Emergency Committee,

to support the Ukrainian crisis. Firstly, the staff will hold a netball match, after school on Friday 18th March, on the Upper School playground. Families are invited to watch and make a donation, should they wish. There will also be a cake sale, led by the staff, on the playground at this time. Secondly, all of the classes will make meaningful items to sell in return for a £1 minimum donation, after school, on Friday 25th March. This will be a Feel Good Friday, and it will be themed 'Feeling' good about helping others'. The items that the children will make and sell will be associated

with sunflowers, the national flower of Ukraine, and friendship, including bookmarks, friendship bracelets and ribbons of hope. There will be another cake sale at this time, very kindly led by a family who wishes to donate cakes to raise funds, too. We will publish further details of the sale nearer the time. In addition, the children will create sunflowers, to display around the school site, to show our respect. We also hope to plant sunflowers.


It continues to be a priority to move forward, in line with guidance, and to adopt increasing normality, to ensure that pupils face limited disruption and are provided with opportunities to thrive.
