Dear Parents and Carers

Undoubtedly you will feel concerned about the pandemic, coronavirus. We continue to follow all advice from the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and Public Health England (PHE), and will update you with new information as it is received.

The current advice is that people who have a persistent cough which is new, or a temperature, are being asked to stay at home for seven days. People with symptoms are no longer required to call NHS 111, as the system is under strain, but are instead urged to look for information on the NHS website and 111 online.

If your child has a new persistent cough or a temperature, please keep them off school for seven days, including the weekend, and telephone the school office to report that this is what you are doing.

Washing hands remains very important and we urge all parents to promote this message, as we are in school.

School life will continue as normal and I ask that the school community remains supportive and as calm as possible through this challenging time.

Veg Power: We are now in the third week of the national campaign Veg Power, which has for our school, been sponsored by Riverford. This week the children have been collecting stickers for eating sweetcorn. Many parents have commented on how successful the campaign is and are delighted that their children are so keen to try more vegetables at home than ever before. Thank you to Elisabeth, Eve and Rakib, who this week wrote letters to me about all of the vegetables they have been eating. Keep the stories coming - I love to hear and read about them!

Year 1 visit the fire station: Our Year I pupils all visited the fire station this week and had a great time. This was part of their current enquiry 'How do we stay safe?'
