We are currently recruiting for a temporary member of the Senior Leadership Team for Terms 5 and 6 and also for a permanent member of the team, from September. Meanwhile, Mrs Amor, will move from her teaching position in Year 2, to teach Class 6H for the remainder of the school year, and Miss Young will teach Class 2A, full time.

Mrs Seek, a long-standing Teaching Assistant, will retire from her role at the start of Term 5. Mrs Seek has supported many, many children over 20 years of work. Her association with the school exceeds this time, as her four children all attended Newbridge. She is retiring to spend more time with them and her grandchildren.

In other news, we offer our congratulations to Mrs Titchener, a Year 2 teacher, who is expecting a baby in August.
