I hope you have had a good week.

Travel to school

At a recent governors' meeting, we discussed what needs to be considered to help ease congestion and ensure safety at the school gates at both drop off and pick up. Discussions were again held around the possibility of a walking bus. We have tried to launch this before, but unfortunately, no one came forward to help with it. If you would like to be involved in considering this again, please let me know. With the much improved weather, it would be appreciated if families could consider walking, cycling or scooting to school, when possible. We have ample scooter and bike storage on the school site.

Please can I again ask all vehicle drivers to drive and park considerately on the neighbouring roads; avoiding parking and waiting on corners, on yellow lines, on zigzags and by dropped kerbs. Parking or waiting directly in front of the school gates is not permitted. This too, poses safety implications when access is restricted and with the volume of adults and children crossing Charmouth Road and entering and exiting the school gates. I do not have any jurisdiction outside of the school gates and therefore, if you notice any dangerous parking, please contact the community police officer by email on 7971@avonandsomerset.police.uk. Your help in any of these matters is greatly appreciated.

In the past, this has included grandparents and preschoolers – the more the merrier. It is not competitive in any way, other than perhaps setting an individual challenge of walking or running a number of target laps each week.
