Dear Parents and Carers

The news of restrictions not being lifted on 21st June came as a blow on Monday. We had commenced planning for some events to take place with parents present, however, sadly these will no longer be able to take place in the same way. I'd really hoped that the end of the school year would have brought wider opportunities, for all – it is such a shame, but we will continue to do our best under the circumstances and provide as many end of year activities and processes as we can, safely.

Messages from Public Health this week

As you will be aware, we have seen a rise in the number of cases of Covid-19 across the country, specifically cases of the Delta variant and this remains a cause for concern. With this, please note that there has been no change in the national guidance issued around testing, tracing and containment in schools.

- All adults in families households with children aged under 11 are asked to continue to undertake LFD testing at least twice a week.
- In the event of a positive LFD result, or the onset of COVID symptoms, a PCR test must be taken to confirm the case, and the individual and their contacts must self-isolate immediately.
- Contacts of a positive case are now also encouraged to take a PCR test, even without symptoms, to quickly detect secondary cases. Please note that if a contact's PCR test is negative, they must still continue to isolate for the remainder of their isolation period as they could still be incubating the virus.
- Public Health England recommend that children with non-COVID specific symptoms of acute respiratory infection do not go into school if they are unwell, as a general rule, and seek a PCR test if they (or their families) progress to COVID 19 symptoms whilst unwell.

Year 5 at Great Wood

Our Year 5 pupils have been to, and returned from, Great Wood Camp in Somerset. They spent three days and two nights there in glorious weather. I too, was fortunate to be able to visit for the day on Tuesday. It is such a beautiful site and seeing the children having an amazing time, being supported by brilliant staff, was absolutely worth all of the planning and anticipation around whether or not the trip could happen. It was a perfect trip for the children after everything they have been through over the past fifteen months, and I am very proud of them all for overcoming any challenges, and for giving everything their best shot whilst they were there. 
