It has been a week of special treats, and the Year 6 children performing at The Forum in Bath on Tuesday night, was a real highlight. We were kindly invited to take part in a Festival of Dance, arranged by Oldfield School. In pre-Covid times, the Dance Umbrella event was a must on the calendar and it has been greatly missed by the children and their families. But, on Tuesday, we were back, in style! 27 children committed to rehearsing with the generous help of Mrs Bartlett, Mrs O'Gara and Kitty O'Gara, and put on the best show. Everyone who was there, was thrilled. The children, although possibly nervous, had the biggest grins on their faces. It was a heartening evening, and made us realise what we had missed in recent years and how important these wider opportunities are. Well done, to you all. We were so very proud of you.

I couldn't believe how many parents and carers stepped up for the running race we had to run six adult races! What a competitive and fun bunch you showed yourselves to be! #### Staffing and Classes for September

We have now completed all of the necessary recruitment processes to be able to set our class structure for September. This will be shared with you on Tuesday, in preparation for the children's 'moving-up afternoon' on Thursday 7th July. Unusually, we will have four new teaching staff members starting in September. We are excited by this and recognise that some change is good for everyone's development and in bringing new ideas. The teaching staff leaving at the end of the year are Mr Cumpson and Mrs Button, who

are moving on to new ventures in education, and Mrs Titchener, who will take maternity absence. I have previously mentioned that Mr Cumpson is leaving after 20 years of teaching at Newbridge, but more recently, we learnt that Mrs Button has been appointed to a role in the Special Educational Needs department of a secondary school – something she has had her mind set on for some time. Mrs Button has worked in year groups across the school for 12 years, and throughout this time has demonstrated excellence in teaching and an outstanding commitment to the children she has taught. As a school we have benefited from her experience and expertise, and especially in leading English. Her enthusiasm for learning, which she has imparted to hundreds of children, will be sorely missed. Taking up the new role has been a very difficult decision for her, however, she is excited to be taking on a new challenge, and we wish her every success.

Our new teaching staff are Mr Mullee, Mrs Gamon, Mrs Berridge and Mr Newman. Mr Newman was appointed earlier in the year, to replace Mr Hempleman who left at Easter, however, this substantive post was not due to commence until September. We warmly welcome each of them to our school.
