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Friday 2nd July, 2021 Dear Parents and Carers

It seems as if the end of term will be upon us very soon. Whilst another year of so many twists and turns, it has gone incredibly quickly. I am desperate for us all to get to the end of the year without any year group or bubble closures, and I am sure you are too. We have managed incredibly well to this point and therefore I ask for your support in following all of the government advice, especially around isolating if a contact of a positive case, so that we can do our best to keep all classes open.

Messages from Public Health

Please can I also ask that you also take note of the following information:

- All adults in family households with children aged under 11 are asked to continue to undertake LFD testing at least twice a week.
- In the event of a positive LFT result, or the onset of COVID symptoms, a PCR test must be taken to confirm the case, and the individual and their contacts must self-isolate immediately.
- Contacts of a positive case are encouraged to take a PCR test, even without symptoms, to quickly detect secondary cases. Please note that if a contact's PCR test is negative, they must still continue to isolate for the remainder of their isolation period as they could still be incubating the virus.
- Public Health England recommend that children with non-COVID specific symptoms of acute respiratory infection do not go into school if they are unwell, and seek a PCR test if they (or their families) progress to COVID 19 symptoms whilst unwell.

Remote Learning

In the event of a class or year group closure at Newbridge, the plan remains for the children's learning to be provided through Google Classroom. Please check that you are still familiar with your child's login details and access to the materials. Activities to the end of term

We had all been waiting to see if we could hold any end of year activities in the usual way. Sadly, we know that any restrictions will not be lifted until 19th July, at the earliest. We had planned how we could hold the Year 6 Production, Sports Days, the Leavers' Assembly and the Leavers' Tea, had restrictions changed in time for families to attend. Unfortunately, they haven't, and we have had to revise our plans. The Year 6 families received a letter yesterday detailing how these important closure activities and events will now be managed. For all other year groups, we had planned to welcome parents to Sports Days, but these plans have had to be revised, too.

Each year group will have its own Sports Afternoon or Sports Morning, commencing next week. The children have been practising the activities ready for their House competition and we are sure, that although these events will not be usual without parents in attendance, the children will still have a fun and memorable time.

Classes for September

The children were told today who their teacher(s) will be in the next academic year - the full list is published below.

To support transition, a number of activities are planned. On Friday 9th July, the children will meet their new teacher in their current classroom. On Monday 19th and Tuesday 20th July the children will move, for some of the day, with their current teacher to their classroom base for September. With this, they will spend time on the playground they will access in September. This is able to happen as the Year 6 pupils will be attending their residential visit to Kilve. In addition, the receiving teacher will post a short video on your child's current Google Classroom Stream, so that they can introduce themselves to you. This will be available by the end of next week.

Teaching staff have a number of transition activities they will complete to hand over class information to the receiving teacher. There will be scheduled meetings on Tuesday 6th July, Thursday 2nd September and two weeks into September.

There are some changes to the teaching staffing for next year. Miss Keane has made the decision to travel to and work as a teacher in Dubai. Mrs Titchener, who currently works in another role in school, and who recently taught in Year 2, has been appointed to this vacancy. Mr Baigent has made the decision to hang up his paint brushes and will be retiring from his role as Art specialist. Following Mrs Houston's retirement as Music specialist last July, we have appointed another Music specialist to continue in this role – Mrs Best will join our team from September. In a later newsletter I will provide more information about these changes and appointments, but wanted to make you aware at this time.


