### **Dear Parents and Carers**

We have completed, for the first time in three years, a full school year. And whilst we have not been able to fulfil all of the activities on the school calendar, we have done pretty well. The second part of the year has seen all of the vibrancy and colour that is Newbridge Primary School, and I am grateful that we have all been able to enjoy and experience this, again.

#### Our children

Our children stand out. I am proud of all they have each achieved this year, and wish to thank them for their commitment to their learning and to our school community. They are wonderful Newbridge citizens. I wish to say a very big well done to our Ladybird and Bee Class pupils, who have completed their very first year at school. There were some slightly teary parents this morning at drop off – seeing all that their children had achieved, and feeling very proud.

Sadly, a number of children from different year groups will leave today as they move to new areas and new schools. We wish Jos, Flo, Scarlett, Teddy, Felix, Daniel, Kiki and Cash every success and happiness.

Today is all about our Year 6 pupils, who are flying the nest after up to seven years in our care. From four year olds in Reception, who I remember vividly, today we see confident, caring, healthy young people who will actively and responsibly make a difference to our world. Last Tuesday and Wednesday evening, all of the children were afforded the opportunity of showcasing their many talents in their Year 6 production – Sherherazade. It was a night all of the parents, aunts, uncles, brothers, sisters and grandparents will remember forever. It was the show of the year. The togetherness of the year group stood out, with every child playing their part with such enthusiasm and enjoyment. The acting, dancing and singing were exceptional. I still don't know how, at the age of ten and eleven years old, they are able to learn their lines and deliver them with such fluency and confidence. These were two very special nights, nights which confirmed the children will go far, and that anything is possible. Last night the children had their Year 6 Leavers' Tea and Disco - more fun was had with a photo booth, a snow machine – and very energetic dancing in between! And finally today was their Leavers' Assembly. The last time we, and families had the chance to recognise and celebrate them all – wishing them well and sending them off on the next stage of their journey. It has been an absolute pleasure and privilege, Year 6, we are so proud of you.

With this, I need to acknowledge the Year 6 families who will leave Newbridge today - there are twenty seven families who will move to pastures new. Some of these parents have had very long associations with our school, having had multiple children attend. Some parents have played significant roles in the school's development and success, particularly as school governors or, and as, long serving members of the NPSA. Our school would not be all that it is without this support - many tireless hours of commitment, all with a desire to help, give back and make our community stronger. Thank you, I am extremely grateful for your skill and support – knowing you held these roles and seeing what can be achieved, has been heartening. I wish you all well for the future.

Our NPSA continues to be a stalwart of support and cements together all that our school stands for. After another bumper year, and seeing so clearly how funds have been raised and spent, in last week's NPSA newsletter, (which you can find <u>here</u>) we are fortunate to have all roles filled for September to be able to go again. Led superbly by Katherine Wellings, the NPSA has again had to, for some part of the year, find novel ways to deliver events and cope with changes and cancellations, but this has never deterred them from their work. A special thank you is offered to Katherine, who steps down as Chair, and to Mim Wharf and Fiona Remnant, who each have their last child leaving Newbridge today. As committee members and trustees, they have each given back, so many times over; thank you.

Thank you, too, to the many, many volunteers who have planned events, run stalls, organised cake sales, made posters, gathered prizes, sold uniform, written newsletters, led on social media....the list is endless. And without the coordination and support of the class representatives, none of this would likely get off the ground.

Thank you to each class rep, some of whom oversee two classes.

I am also very grateful to our governing body who has again helped to steer us through some difficult decision making and help shape our future. In particular, my thanks is expressed to Sarah Evans, our Chair of Governors, who voluntarily offers leadership and support. A number of governors are stepping down from their roles at the end of the year. Thank you to Daniel Vilalta and Julia Hilton who have served terms, offering sound advice. And thank you to Sarah Webb, Katy Hancock and Emma Puzey, who have served multiple terms. Their work has been outstanding, together completing over 30 years of governance. They have made an incredible contribution to our school, and I am personally most grateful for this.

And with being able to have volunteers back in school, we express our sincere appreciation for the support you have been able to give; whether it be with reading, cooking, making, school visits, gardening....it has all been so much appreciated and has made a difference to our children and our school.

And this brings me to the staff. Through more change and uncertainty this year, the large staff team have worked tirelessly for our children and families. Their commitment, care and enthusiasm is second to none and I thank each and every one of them for making our school so successful and for providing all of the opportunities for the children, across the curriculum.

We need to say goodbye to a number of staff as the year draws to a close. We wish Mr Cumpson, Mrs Button, Mrs Hunt, Mrs Stacey and Mr Burton every success for the future. We also send our very best wishes to Mrs Titchener, as she and her husband expect their first child very soon. And in very recent news, we congratulate Miss Young, who has secured a full-time teaching post for September, with Mrs Best being appointed to teach alongside Mrs Amor, in Year 3.
