Dear Parents and Carers

This week has highlighted that we are dealing with a very real and serious situation and that at any moment a decision may need to be taken to close a class or year group, with children needing to learn from home. Our first class closure came on Wednesday, which proved upsetting for all staff. As a school we are so proud to have worked tirelessly and to have kept every class open for over eleven weeks, with an average attendance of 98%

Please know that we wish to avoid any closure and therefore ask you again to please comply with our safety procedures in support of this. Most importantly these are:

- When approaching the school, and when waiting, ensure that the 2 metre distancing rule is observed;
- Not gathering in groups at the school entrances and leaving promptly at drop off and collection;
- Arriving at the allocated collection times, ensuring there are not excess people waiting who have arrived too early;
- Giving way to others and moving to one side to allow parents/carers and children to leave safely;
- All children washing their hands when leaving home and before entering school;
- Parents and carers, whenever possible, wearing face coverings at both the Charmouth Road gate and Newbridge Hill gate when dropping off and collecting;
- Only using Breakfast Club and After School Club when absolutely necessary, and
- That parents form a childcare bubble with only one other household for the purposes of informal childcare, when absolutely necessary.

If your child's class is closed and therefore isolating, please can parents and carers contact the school office to notify of any Covid-19 symptoms and if a test is being sought.

Please see a poster attached, from Public Health, which provides you with information of what to do in the event of displaying symptoms of Covid-19, having had contact with a positive case of Covid-19 or testing positive for Covid-19.

Symptoms of Covid-19

Any pupil or adult displaying symptoms of Covid-19 is not permitted to enter the premises.

The most important symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough;
- a high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

If anyone has any of the symptoms above, they, and their household members, should self-isolate at home and request a test. Whilst awaiting test results, the household must continue to isolate. If the test is negative, and no other members of the household display symptoms, the isolation period will cease and children should return to school immediately.

This is different to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receiving the government funded school meals. The qualifying benefits are: Income Support; Job Seekers Allowance; Employment Support Allowance; Child Tax Credit; Pension Credit; Working Tax Credit run-on; Asylum Seeker or Universal Credit. 
2G turned into a cake shop during their maths lesson and they had to find the exact amount to pay for the treats!

Year 5 have had a super week with maths outside and making amazing orreries in Design Technology. Well done everyone.


















Ruth lives at Newbridge Towers and it was her birthday this week. Elsa and Elodie in 6A made her a card and a little present. What a caring thought.

Year 6 As part of our science looking at how shadows are formed, we created shadow puppets.
























NGT NOW CLOSED

COVID-19 information

A quick guide for parents and carers



Please follow the advice in this guide. Only contact the school if your child is having a test and to let us know the result. Your school will not be able to advise beyond the information given here. Please remember to only get tested if you have COVID-19 symptoms.

YOU SHOULD BOOK A TEST IF YOUR CHILD HAS:

a high temperature

This means they feel hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure their temperature)

or a new continuous cough

This means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough it may be worse than usual)

Or a loss of or change to your sense of smell or taste

This means they've noticed they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child DOES NOT have symptoms of COVID-19 but has other cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, they do not need to be tested and they or members of your household do not need to self-isolate. Your child can attend school if fit to do so.
