500,000 children estimated to be sexually abused each year in the UK



840,000 individuals pose some level of sexual risk to children

Understanding How Children Are Exploited



Child Exploitation normally follows three stages.



 Recruitment. This can take various forms but can be described as a grooming process. ...



• **Control.** This is an essential element in the process as it establishes the dominance of the perpetrator over the victim. ...



Exploitation.



Forms of child exploitation includes:

 Debt bondage, where children are forced to work to pay off loans that they cannot repay with money or goods.



Sexual exploitation.



• Criminal exploitation, where children are coerced or manipulated into committing crimes, such as drug trafficking, theft, or violence.




• Modern slavery, where children are deprived of their freedom and forced to work or provide services for others.



 Early or forced marriage, where children are married off without their consent or against their will.

What is Sexual exploitation:

Anybody can be a perpetrator of CSE, no matter their age, gender or race. The relationship could be framed as friendship, someone to look up to or romantic. Children and young people who are exploited may also be used to 'find' or coerce others to join groups.

They may trust their abuser and not understand that they're being abused.

Some of the most common signs of CSE include:



- skipping school or getting in trouble in class
- going missing for periods of time or coming back from things late regularly
- mood swings that seem out of the ordinary
- having gifts that can't be accounted for
- over sexualised behaviour, or sending inappropriate images from their mobile phone
- using drugs and/or alcohol
- unexplained bruising or other signs of physical harm.
- Change in appearance. STI's or pregnancy





What is Criminal exploitation:





Criminal exploitation is child abuse where children and young people are manipulated and coerced into committing crimes.











What is County Lines?

County Lines is the police term for urban gangs exploiting young people into moving drugs from a hub, normally a large city, into other markets - suburban areas and market and coastal towns - using dedicated mobile phone lines or "deal lines".

Children as young as 12 years old have been exploited into carrying drugs for gangs. This can involve children being trafficked away from their home area, staying in accommodation and selling and manufacturing drugs

Phrases that young people may use to refer to county lines include:



"Cunch" is slang for "country" (as in "countryside") but can refer to any distant – often rural – area where dealers dispatch their teenage subordinates to peddle drugs, out of sight of the city police and the general public.









Girls and Gangs

A common misconception is that girls and women are less likely to be criminally exploited than their male counterparts or are less likely to be gang involved or affiliated.










Girls can and do play a number of roles in gangs.

- "Wifey's" Girlfriends of gang members
- "Baby Mothers" Girls and women who have children with gang members
- "Links" Girls who are expected to have sex or group sex with gang members at anytime.
- "Gift Girls" Girls who are "given" to a new member of a gang or criminal network as a reward for proving themselves as trustworthy and reliable.

What is Online Exploitation and Grooming?



Online Grooming – The act of developing a relationship with a child to enable their abuse and exploitation both online and offline. Online platforms, such as online gaming, social media, messaging and live streaming, can be used to do this



Online Exploitation – an individual or group using online platforms to take advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child or young person under the age of 18 into sexual and/or criminal activity that can occur both online and offline.








Criminal exploitation online - Perpetrators can use online platforms as a way to criminally exploit young people by coercing them into criminal activity and then monitoring and controlling their movements

The IWF has found there is now more child sexual abuse imagery being discovered on the open internet than ever before – with almost every webpage (92%) it worked to remove in 2023 including "self-generated" material extorted from children who have been groomed or coerced by predators using webcams.

















Report: IWF research into how artificial intelligence (AI) is increasingly being used to create child sexual abuse imagery online.



In 2023, the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) investigated its first reports of child sexual abuse material (CSAM) generated by artificial intelligence (AI).



Initial investigations uncovered a world of text-to-image technology. In short, you type in what you want to see in online generators and the software generates the image.



The technology is fast and accurate – images usually fit the text description very well. Many images can be generated at once – you are only really limited by the speed of your computer. You can then pick out your favourites; edit them; direct the technology to output exactly what you want.





These Al images can be so convincing that they are indistinguishable from real images.

























- 'Snap Map' feature allows others to view your exact location.
- Recent update calculates how long it will take to drive to that destination.


 Can be disabled by using 'Ghost Mode' or turning off the location sharing in the phone settings.





"In this open-world action game, players assume the role of three criminals whose storylines intersect within the fictional city of Los Santos.
