Daily reading

Today please read for 30 minutes.

You could read and discuss the text about Boudicca, read any fact books that you have at home and discuss what you find out about Boudicca via the websites.

Daily times tables

Please continue to learn your year group times tables: 6x, 7x, 9x
If these are a bit tricky, please work on your 2x, 5x and 10x or 3x, 5x and 8x.
Put your times tables onto one set of cards with the answers on another set of cards. Turn them upside down and turn them over to match. If they don't match, turn them back over. If they do match, leave them face-up. Can you remember where all the questions and answers are? What is the least number of goes to turn all the cards over? Can you play against someone else, keeping pairs that you have matched? Learn/practice a different times table each day.

Daily Maths

- Measure objects in your house using a ruler or a tape measure. List the objects you have measured from largest to smallest. Once you have done that convert the measurements into mm, cm and m e.g. Computer monitor : 415mm 41.5cm 0.415m
Pencil case : 230mm 23cm 0.23m

Extension: Find the total length of the objects you have measured. Would the objects you have measured stretch from the front to the back of your house?

FACTS ON BOUDICCA

- Boudicca was the wife of Prasutagus, the ruler of a Celtic tribe called the Iceni.
- The Iceni lived in East Anglia.
- When Romans had a deal with Prasutagus so he could rule.
- When Prasutagus died, the Romans turned on the Iceni.
- They stole from the Iceni tribesmen, made people slaves and they had Boudicca whipped.
- In about 60 AD, the Romans invaded North Wales
- While they were away, Boudicca led an attack against the Romans.
- The Iceni destroyed Colchester a Roman town.
- Then Boudicca and her army destroyed Londinium.
- Over 70,000 people were killed in the attacks by the Britons.
- The Roman army regrouped in the Midlands and finally defeated the Britons.
- Some say Boudicca killed herself when she knew the Romans had defeated her, others say she fell ill and died.

Boudicca is a heroine because she achieved a lot and fought for her country, for her people and for herself.
