Back to School Information about Year 3 September 2022

Welcome

Welcome back to school. We are so excited to start a new academic year and we are so proud with how the classes have settled already.

Meet the team

Class 3BA is taught by Mr s Best and Mrs Amor and Class 3OG is taught by Mrs O’Gara. Our teaching assistant is Miss Cattrall.

Planning, Preparation and Assessment

All teachers are entitled to 10% Planning, Preparation and Assessment time (PPA).

PPA time for Year 3 teachers is on a Wednesday afternoon (this changes to Thursday morning from Term 4). During these sessions your children will be taught by Mr Seaborne (P.E) and Mrs Best (Music).

Overview of a typical day in Year 3

Each morning, the children will arrive and settle into class quickly concentrating on Mental Maths The children will have an hour daily Maths and English lesson. There will also be a whole class reading session at least twice a week, and spelling is taught daily. In the afternoon, the children will engage in our enquiry which this term is ‘What makes a good book?’.

Drinks and Snacks

Please send the children with water and either fruit or vegetable as a snack for morning playtimes. **Please name any snack pots or bags.**

Behaviour and Rewards

Traffic lights will still be used throughout the school. If a child behaves particularly well, shows citizenship values or produces excellent work, their name will be put on the star and they will receive a house point. We will continue to use house points and Star of the Week certificates to reward children. If we need to contact you about a behaviour issue, we will phone parents if it is not possible to speak in person.

Toilets

We encourage the children to use the toilet at playtimes although at the start of Year 3 we are more flexible with this. The children wash/sanitise their hands regularly throughout the day. Please let us know if there are any specific needs if you haven’t done so already.

Supporting your child

For your child to make good progress this year, we will need your support. We know that spellings, reading and times tables practice are vital tools to help your child succeed. Please continue to hear your child read even if they become a free reader in the next couple of terms. We generally find that children’s comprehension does not keep pace with their ability to decode text. They tend not to understand and answer questions on the texts despite being able to read aloud fluently. We will continue to assess your child’s reading through whole class reading sessions as well as standardised reading tests. If your child does not move up a level, it is likely to be because they need to do more work on their comprehension of texts before moving on.

Reading: Whole class reading will be at least twice a week. We are now reading as a whole class as well as groups and individual readers where necessary. Children will be encouraged to change their own reading books daily. Please continue to read regularly with your child at home and ensure that you record in the reading log. We would like the children to aim to read to an adult at home at least 3 times a week. Please fill in the reading log to show when your child has read.

Spellings and Times Tables

Spellings will be sent out termly and will be tested on a Friday each week. Please support your child in learning their words and understanding their meaning of the words.

There is an expectation that the children will know all their times tables facts of 2x, 5x, 10x, 3x, 4x, 8x by the end of Year 3.

We highly recommend apps such as Squeebles or www.timestables.co.uk if you have access to the internet, to support with learning times tables in a fun and interactive way. We cannot emphasise enough how important it is for your child to gain a secure grasp of number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 and their times tables if they are to become confident and number fluent mathematicians. Any help you can give your child in this area is invaluable to accelerating their progress.

P.E.

P.E. will be on a **Tuesday afternoon** and **Wednesday morning** so children should wear their house t-shirt, black jogging bottoms/leggings/ trainers and school jumper on these days.

Long hair must be tied back and earrings must be removed or covered with tape provided from home.

What to bring

Water bottles, waterproof coats, reading books and reading logs should be brought to school every day. The children will still be going into the playground if it is light rain. Please ensure all items of clothing and belongings are named. In Year 3, children do not need to bring in their own pencil cases as equipment is provided.

Inhalers
