Back to School Information about Year 5 September 2022

Welcome

We are delighted to welcome you and your child to Year 5. We are really looking forward to the year ahead and getting to know your children while all learning together. We have a great range of activities planned and have had a really good start to the term. The children have amazed us with their energy and ability to adapt to new surroundings.

In this booklet, we will inform you of some of the important aspects you will need to know in order to support your child throughout Year 5.

Meet the team

Class 5G is taught by Miss Gatton.

Class 5HT is taught by Mr Handson and Mrs Berridge.

Our Teaching Assistants are:

Mrs Milne, Mrs Van Gelderen and Mrs Morgan. The TAs will work across both Year 5 classes supporting children where appropriate.

Learning

In Term 1, our enquiry is based around the Ted Hughes book 'The Iron Man'. The focus is around technology and how it has developed over time. The children really enjoy the book and we have had some wonderful English work using the book as a stimulus.

In Term 2, we will move onto Space, and our enquiry title is 'Do you have what it takes to be an astronaut?'. It is an interesting enquiry and one where we look closely at our Solar System.

Planning, Preparation and Assessment

All teachers are entitled to 10% planning, preparation and assessment time (PPA).

PPA time for Year 5 teachers is on Wednesday mornings. During these sessions your children will be taught by Mr Seaborne (P.E.) and Mrs Best (music) and will need to come to school in their P.E. kits.

Overview of a typical day in Year 5

We start the day in Year 5 by doing our daily mental arithmetic, 10 minutes for 10 calculations. This works really well and the children visit objectives that we may not have practised for a while and are exposed to a wide range of maths vocabulary such as synonyms for the four operations. Additionally, there is daily times tables practice.

Then we move into our maths lesson before break time (which starts at 10:35am).

After break, we have our English session, covering aspects such as spelling, punctuation and grammar before embarking on our writing focus.

Lunch is between 12 and 1pm followed by whole class guided reading and each afternoon we will deliver the rest of the curriculum subjects.

Drinks and Snacks

Please send your child with water and either fruit or vegetable as a snack for morning playtimes.

Please name any snack pots or bags.

Behaviour and Rewards

In line with our behaviour policy, the traffic lights will continue to be used. If a child behaves particularly well, their name will be put on the star. We will continue to use house points and Star of the Week certificates to reward children. If we need to contact you about a behaviour issue, we will phone parents if it is not possible to speak in person.

Toilets

We encourage the children to use the toilet at playtimes.

Please let us know if there are any specific needs.

Reading at home: As we all know, reading is an essential skill and we strongly encourage children to read on a daily basis. While we set time aside to read at school, we feel reading at home is essential. Therefore, we would like your child to read at least four times a week and record it in their Reading Record. Some children like to read independently, which is absolutely fine. However, we do ask that adults take time to ask their children about the book they are reading and encourage them to discuss the characters and plot. We are happy too, if children read aloud or to another sibling - every little helps.

Spellings and Times Tables

The list of this term's spellings can be viewed on our website. Please look closely at these and support your child in learning the spelling patterns and words from the Year 5/6 spelling list. The children will be tested each Friday. Please continue to practise times tables every week. Times tables are the foundations to many areas within mathematics and will support your child as the curriculum objectives become increasingly complex. We cannot stress enough how valuable knowing your tables to 12 x 12 is - so please help your child in learning those specific tables they have trouble with.

Water bottles, waterproof coats, reading books and reading record books should be brought to school every day.

Please ensure all items of clothing and belongings are named.

P.E.

Our P.E. days are **Monday** and **Wednesday** and the children should come to school wearing full PE kit. Long hair must be tied back and earrings must be removed or covered with tape provided from home.

Inhalers
