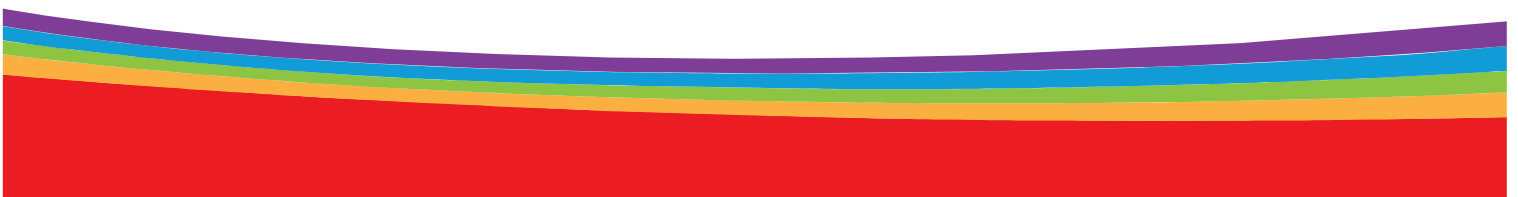

Learning

Planning, Preparation and Assessment

Drinks and Snacks

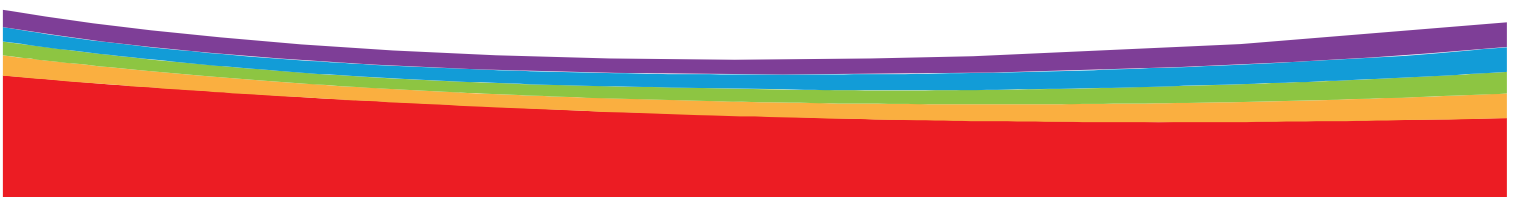
Please send the children with water and either fruit or vegetable as a snack for morning playtimes.

We have been really impressed so far, the children have demonstrated how kind, thoughtful and caring they are. If we need to contact you about a behaviour issue, we will phone you if it is not possible to speak in person.

Toilets

Key Stage 2 - We encourage the children to use the toilet at playtimes. Please let us know if there are any specific needs.



Supporting your child

Reading at home: - this is imperative and needs to be done daily to build stamina in preparation for secondary school.

Homework: children will be set homework on Mondays and should be handed in the following Monday. All work will be marked with your child in class – try to ensure this learning is as independent as possible.

Spellings: will be given out and are also available on the website. The children will be tested weekly on a Friday. Please continue to practise times tables every week to ensure fluency to support the Year 6 maths curriculum. Please [click here](#) find our Homework policy and our [class page](#) on the website.

Equipment

Water bottles, waterproof coats and reading books should be brought to school every day. In Year 6, children do not need to bring in their own pencil cases as equipment is provided.

Please ensure all items of clothing and belongings are named.

P.E.

Our days are **Tuesday and Thursday** and children should come into school in their PE kit.

Long hair must be tied back (as it should be in class) and earrings must be removed or covered with tape provided from home.
