What another fantastic week we've had, topped off today by our now established monthly Feel Good Friday. Young Voices: The highlight of the week has to be the 108 choir members attending Young Voices at the World Resort Arena in Birmingham on Tuesday. What an incredible experience this was and I feel privileged to have been a part of this on the day.

For many months the children have committed to learning the song words and dance movements, both at home and through their attendance at choir rehearsals. Their investment paid off when they could perform with such joy, with 7,000 other school children, to a packed arena. I am incredibly proud of every single child who took part and who stepped up for and loved the challenge and excitement of the day. Undoubtedly this experience will have instilled confidence, teamwork and self-belief. This opportunity could not have happened without the support of the school staff and volunteers. Please note the Year 3 Class Assembly has been changed to 19th March. Meeting for parents: On Tuesday 4th February, Androulla Nicolaou from Avon and Somerset Police will deliver an information session at 6.30pm. This session will aim to raise awareness of the criminal exploitation of children and the use of social media apps and gaming. Nationally there has been an increase in media coverage of child exploitation and this session is being held to inform parents more about this topic and provide an opportunity to ask questions of a specialist practitioner. Please rest assured there is no need to be concerned or alarmed; I booked this session with Androulla having been involved in training that she led as part of my safeguard training and I was very impressed with her knowledge, delivery and approach. In the daytime Androulla will provide workshops appropriately pitched for Year 5 and 6 children and will also lead staff professional development after school.

Term dates: As we are a maintained Bath and North East Somerset school, we follow their term dates. Within the terms set, we also have to set five training (INSET) days a year. Our professional development is timed to support new members of staff, new initiatives, the school development plan and planning. Two training days have been set so far for next year - Tuesday 1st September (please note there is only one INSET day at this time of year, not the usual two) and Monday 4th January. Three further dates need to be agreed and these will be shared with you as soon as possible.

Please check and treat: Please can I request that all parents are vigilant with regards to checking for headlice and threadworms, and treating where necessary, as we have had an increased number of reported cases lately.
