<p>Daily reading</p>	<p>We hope that you were able to access Oxford Owl (https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/) Did you manage to access The Big Carrot? https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital_books/1394.html Today we would like you to have a go at Activity 1. If you are unable to access this eBook, please used the PDF version of the same story that we have attached for you. See if your child can recall the events of the story in order.</p>
<p>Daily counting</p>	<p>Number hunt! How many of these objects can you count around your house?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Clocks - Cushions - Phones - Picture frames <p>Lots of families have been accessing the BBC Bitesize Maths Learning, here is the link if you would like to access this yourself. There is currently no Reception Section, but some of the Year 1 material may be suitable for your child. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/dailylessons</p>
<p>Tricky words</p>	<p>Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Peg the tricky words on a line. Unpeg them and put them in a basket when you know them - Put the tricky words in a box. Rummage around and pick out a tricky word to read - Write the tricky words on a label and stick them to a toy car. Draw some parking spaces with the matching tricky word on a piece of paper. Drive in the matching tricky word! - Write the tricky word in lots of different sizes! - Chalk the tricky word on paper, chalkboard or paving.
<p>Daily Maths</p>	<p>Yesterday, we began to learn how to subtract single digit numbers. Today, draw out 10 objects, or have 10 real objects in front of you. Call out a single digit number that your child needs to subtract from the group of objects. How many are left? If this is too challenging, again, you may like to start with subtracting 1 from the group. If this is too easy, you may like to subtract single digit numbers from a group of 20.</p>
<p>Daily English/Phonics</p>	<p>Phonics: Today's sound is the short 'oo' sound. Can you think of any short 'oo' words yourself? Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – book, took, look, shook Can you circle the digraph 'oo' in each word? (e.g. <u>key</u> - 2 letters that make one sound) Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is? What does 'oo' look like in capital letters? Optional game - https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/reading-robot Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p> <p>Writing: Someone has stolen The Big Carrot! How on earth will we make soup for all of those people without it?! We will have to make a WANTED poster to try and get it back! You could include a big picture of the carrot in the middle so that people know what to look for and some sentences about why it is so important to find it! Maybe there could even be a reward for the person who returns the carrot! Remember to use capital letters and full stops, tricky words, cursive writing AND finger spaces!</p>
