Reception class have been working on their writing of CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words and doing this independently. It has been great to see how many of the children are becoming more confident with their writing – well done!





Year 2 In science we looked at hygiene. We completed an experiment to show how germs spread. We used hand lotion and glitter to represent the germs. Then we gave each other a high five to see how far our germs spread! We also looked at the topic "teeth". We discussed why it is important to brush your teeth twice a day and how to brush them correctly.

This afternoon Reception class went to look remembrance table and they placed a poopy wreath they had made. This afternoon we listened to readings of the poems 'In Flanders Fields' and 'For the Fallen', read superbly by Year 5 and Year 6. All the children demonstrated our school values and were very



respectful when entering and leaving the hall in silence.
