
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

As you will be aware we have had cases of Strep A/Scarlet Fever in school. The symptoms of scarlet fever include:



- A sore throat
- A Headache
- Fever
- Nausea
- Vomiting

This is followed by a fine red rash which typically first appears on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body. On more darkly pigmented skin, the scarlet rash may be harder to spot, but it should feel like 'sandpaper'. The face can also be flushed red but pale around the mouth. If you are concerned about your child, please seek medical assistance immediately. If your child has an underlying condition which affects their immune system, you should contact your GP or hospital doctor to discuss whether any additional measures are needed. Please do remember that in most cases StrepA/Scarlet Fever is usually a very mild illness.

The strength and depth of the Trust is to be found in the people who make up the whole, and together, the Trust will continue to thrive.

Thank you all for your ongoing commitment and I look forward to working with you through the remainder of my time as your CEO.
