

The Importance of Very Good Attendance:

Northbrook Primary Academy is committed to ensuring all children have regular and full attendance and the importance of this is understood by children and their families. Government research shows a direct link between attendance and attainment and good attenders make better progress, learn to work with others, and are better prepared for transitions within our school and to secondary school. Absence may also mean that a child is more vulnerable to safeguarding risks, such as child exploitation. As a school, we work hard to create a culture where children want to attend and all our schools invest in working with families to identify and remove barriers to full attendance. 96%+
VERY GOOD

At this level, you give yourself the best chance of achieving your potential, 96% equals 7.5 days absence in a year.

93% - 95.9%
COULD BE BETTER
95% means a half-day missed every 2 weeks. In a year, that's 43 lessons to catch up on.

90.1% - 92.9%
IMPROVEMENT REQUIRED
92% equals 3 weeks of lost learning every year. Between Y7 and Y11, this means 15 weeks lost in total.

90% and below
PERSISTENTLY ABSENT
At 90%, you have missed almiost 100 lessons in a year.
Attendance at 90% each year means that by Y11, you will have missed out on 6 months learning.

Families are expected to inform school in the morning as soon as is possible if their child is going to be absent due to ill health or for any other unavoidable reason. If a child is absent from school and a parent does not report it, the school will carry out a first day absence procedure. This will involve some or all of the points below:

- •Contacting you by Parentapp, text message, email or telephone.
- Contacting you by letter.
- •If necessary, carrying out a home visit.

<u>Leave during term time</u>: Any absence during term time can affect pupil's education and progress as much as any other absence. If leave is being requested for a holiday or extended leave abroad, approval should be obtained from the head teacher before making any bookings. Leave of absence in term time will not be granted unless:

- a request for leave has been made in advance by a parent with whom the pupil normally resides, and
- the head teacher considers that leave of absence should be granted due to the **exceptional circumstances** relating to the request.

Any period of leave taken without the agreement of the school, or in excess of that agreed, will be classed as unauthorised and schools may request legal sanctions such as a penalty notice.

Penalty Notices: This academic year, there are new national rules on how penalty notices for school absence are used. The new rules mean that all schools must consider giving a penalty notice to a parent when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons within a 10-school week period. The fine for school absence penalty notices across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. If parents do not pay the fine they may be prosecuted in court. If a parent receives a second penalty notice for the same child within any three-year



period, the charge will be a flat rate of £160; there will be no reduction if paid within 21 days. Penalty notices for absence before the 2024-25 school year do not count. A parent cannot receive more than two penalty notices for the same child within any three-year period. This is because it is clear that previous penalty notices have not worked. Once this limit has been reached, another action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

<u>Persistent absence</u>: Attendance of below 90% is considered to be in the persistent absence category. Children who are persistently absent will be monitored and schools will ensure that an individual plan to support them will be implemented. In situations of persistent unauthorised absence, a referral will be made to the local authority to consider a penalty notice fine or legal proceedings for a prosecution under s.444 of the 1996 Education Act.

<u>Poor punctuality</u>: When children miss the start of the day, they can miss out on vital work and routines which can impact their learning significantly. Where punctuality is an issue, staff will work with children and families to identify the reasons and look to implement support to improve punctuality. If a pupil continues to be late after the registers close, there may be further sanctions under unauthorised absence.


and team work shown whilst working together to solve the problem. Well done Year 6 and safe riding!





In the news this week

E-commerce company, Amazon, has told all staff they need to return to the office five days a week next year, ending the option to work from home. In a message to all workers, Chief Executive Andy Jassy said the company expected everyone to be in the office full time (apart from some exceptions) from 2nd January, 2025. Amazon's new policy is very different from the UK government's approach, which is to make flexible working a right for employees, as promised in a new law proposal, due to be announced later this year.
