

- ✓ We are committed to promoting positive mental health and well-being for everyone.







End of Term Early Closure: School closes at the slightly earlier time of 2:10/2:15pm on **Friday 20**th **December.** There will no After School Club Provision on this day. Children return to school at 8:45am on Tuesday 7th January.



Christmas Party Day & Christmas Dinner: We will be hosting our Christmas Parties on Thursday 19th December as well as our whole school Christmas dinner. On this day children will be able to attend school in non-uniform. If they wish, the children can come to school dressed in Christmas jumpers, Christmas themed clothes, or clothes in the traditional Christmas colours to make their party day especially festive. We will be raising money for 'Save the Children' and from Monday 16th December, we will be adding a

£1 voluntary donation item on ParentPay. Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will have their party after lunch and Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 will have their party before lunch. At lunchtime, we will be serving Christmas lunch for all our children and staff. There will be no other choice of meals for children on this day apart from a vegetarian Christmas lunch option (for children entitled to benefit tested free school meals, there will be a small selection of sandwiches. Please inform the office if you would like your child to have a sandwich instead). The alternative is for children to bring in their own packed lunch from home. Thank you in advance of your co-operation.

Attendance Matters... On Monday we will be writing to all parents to inform them of their child's percentage attendance for the autumn term (Term 1). Our aspirational target for all children is that they achieve 96% attendace for the academic year. We understand that there are times when children are unfit to attend school, however, this should be rare (unless there are exceptional individual circumstances). We closely track attendance data and work with families to support when we can. Our school has always been proud to have attendance figures above the national averages but more recently we have found that attendance has dipped and this is especailly true for boys.

We kow that attendance percentages usually rise through the year and current figures can be impacted by a prolonged illness. We also know the vast majority of our children have very good attendance.

What does good attendance really mean?

- 100%-95% attendance gives your child the best start in life ...
- 94%-90% attendance makes it harder to learn and progress to your child's full abililty...
- 90%-85% attendance is regarded as being persistently absent and negatively impacts progress...
- 85% attendance and below seriously affects your child's learning and development...

100% Attendance	0 days missed
95% Attendance	9 days' absence or 1 week and 4 days of missed learning.
90% Attendance	19 days' absence or 3 weeks and 4 days of missed learning.
85% Attendance	29 days' absence or 5 weeks and 4 days of missed learning. Almost one-half term missed.
80% Attendance	38 days' absence or 7 weeks and 3 days of missed learning.
75% Attendance	48 days' absence or 9 weeks and 6 days of missed learning.

Did you Know? 90% attendance, although it

sounds really positive, actually means your child will miss the equivalent of a ½ day a week or 19 days a year or 247 days over your child's primary and secondary education (1 year and 10 weeks).




