Once again South Ribble Borough Council are providing support to families in South Ribble by providing free children's activities and healthy meals during the upcoming school holiday. This Christmas, they have an exciting programme of events including a pantomime, skateboarding, gymnastics, swimming, football and much more. Including 'Active Camp' based at Northbrook Primary Academy, for Years 1 to Year 6, on Tuesday

2nd, Wednesday 3rd, Thursday 4th & Friday 5th January. Year 6 Bike ability will take place on Monday 8th January to Friday 12th January. Bikeability involves the first morning on the playground achieving the Level 1 award. If the riders are competent and pass Level 1 they will then go out in the afternoon to start learning the skills required for Level 2 on quiet roads. All children are required to pass the Level 1 award before they can move onto Level 2. We will also be running 'Tots on Tyres' for Reception and 'Scoot Safe' for Year 3, at

the start of the new term. We have sent information out this week and will remind parents and children before we come back after the holidays!



Dr Bike is also scheduled to take place Thursday 18th **January.** This is a free service where qualified mechanics come to Northbrook to carry out bike maintenance. Please feel free to bring your bikes into school on this day, we have a maximum of 25 bike maintenance places available.



Forest School January 2024: Over next half term your child will have the opportunity to participate in Forest School. The sessions will take place in the forest school area within the school grounds. The class has been divided into two groups and sessions will either take place on Tuesdays or Thursdays for your child. A letter has already been sent out to confirm which day. Please ensure your child is dressed in their PE kit bringing the following clothing with them:

- Outdoor shoes (walking boots or wellingtons)
- Warm socks
- Warm, waterproof coat
- Change of trousers
- Waterproof over-trousers if possible
- School uniform to change into if necessary

Winter Water Safety: In winter, more people who are walking or running alongside water fall in and drown than in any other season. Slippery paths, patches of ice and a lack of daylight can make being near water more dangerous than in the summer months. If you fall into the water, the cold temperatures make it difficult for you to control your breathing, to use your hands to climb out and can even cause you to have a heart attack. Uniform and Appearance: We would like to remind everyone of our expectations related to uniform and the key information can be found on our website <u>here</u>. A key feature of our policy is what we wear (uniform) and how we wear it (appearance). In summary, some key points of note are:

- Grey skirt/pinafore, trousers or shorts.
- Leather style and sturdy school shoes for **non**-PE days *trainers and ballet style pumps are not permitted*.
- Full PE kit required for PE days (NPA hoodie & t-shirt, black shorts, black jogging bottoms and trainers)
- Plain black jogging bottoms (on PE days).
- Hair colour should be natural with no severe cuts or styles.

What does good attendance really mean?

- 100%-95% attendance gives your child the best start in life ...
- 94%-90% attendance makes it harder to learn and progress to your child's full ability...
- 90%-85% attendance is regarding as being persistently absent and negatively impacts progress...
- 85% attendance and below serioulsy affects your child's learning and development...

Did you Know? 90% attendance, although it sounds really positive, actually means your child will miss the equivalent a ½ day a week or 19 days a year or 247 days over your child's primary and secondary education (1 year and 10 weeks).

100% Attendance for	0 days missed
95% Attendance	9 days' absence or 1 week and 4 days of missed learning.
90% Attendance	19 days' absence or 3 weeks and 4 days of missed learning.
85% Attendance	29 days' absence or 5 weeks and 4 days of missed learning. Almost one-half term missed.
80% Attendance	38 days' absence or 7 weeks and 3 days of missed learning.
75% Attendance	48 days' absence or 9 weeks and 6 days of missed learning.
