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Attendance Matters... Next week will be writing to all parents to inform them of their child's percentage attendance for the autumn term (Term 1). <u>Our aspirational target for all children is that they achieve 98% attendace for the academic year</u>. We understand that there are times when children are unfit to attend school, however, this should be rare (unless there are exceptional individual circumstances). We closely track attedance data and work with families to support when we can. Our school has always been proud to have attedance figures above the national averages but more recently we have found that attendance has dipped and this is especially true for boys. We kow that attendance percentages usually rise through the year and current figures can be impacted by a prolonged illness. We also know the vast majority of our children have very good attendance.

What does good attendance really mean?

- 100%-95% attendance gives your child the best start in life ...
- 94%-90% attendance makes it harder to learn and progress to your child's full ability...
- 90%-85% attendance is regarding as being persistently absent and negatively impacts progress...
- 85% attendance and below serioulsy affects your child's learning and development...

100% Attendance for	0 days missed
95% Attendance	9 days' absence or 1 week and 4 days of missed learning.
90% Attendance	19 days' absence or 3 weeks and 4 days of missed learning.
85% Attendance	29 days' absence or 5 weeks and 4 days of missed learning. Almost one-half term missed.
80% Attendance	38 days' absence or 7 weeks and 3 days of missed learning.
75% Attendance	48 days' absence or 9 weeks and 6 days of missed learning.

Did you Know? 90% attendance, although it sound really positive, actually means your child will miss the equivalent a ½ day a week or 19 days a year or 247 days over your child's primary and secondary education (1 year and 10 weeks).



Once again South Ribble Borough Council are providing support to families in South Ribble by providing free children's activities and healthy meals during the upcoming school holiday. This Christmas, they have an exciting programme of events including a pantomime, skateboarding, gymnastics, swimming, football and much more. Including 'Active Camp' based at Northbrook Primary Academy, for Years 1 to Year 6, on Tuesday 2nd, Wednesday 3rd, Thursday 4th & Friday 5th January.

Year 6 Bikeability will take place on Monday 8th January to Friday 12th January. Bikeability involves the first morning on the playground achieving the Level 1 award. If the riders are competent and pass Level 1 they will then go out in the afternoon to start learning the skills required for Level 2 on quiet roads. All children are required to pass the Level 1 award before they can move onto Level 2.We will also be running 'Tots on Tyres' for Reception and 'Scoot Safe' for Year 3, at the start of the new term. We will be sending information next week before we break and will remind the parents and children when we come back after the holidays!
