We are delighted to let you know that from Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2023 we will be taking part in the National School Breakfast Programme. The **free breakfasts** will be **open to all our children from 8:30am-8:45am each morning** in our dining hall. Children attending the breakfast club need to enter school through the main reception. They will be signed in before making their way to the dining hall. The club will be staffed by Northbrook Primary Academy teaching assistants, who will oversee the children and then ensure they move to their classrooms at 8:45am in time for registration. The breakfast on offer will include bagels, a range of cereals and porridge.
