This week in Year 1 we have been looking at Monet. We know that Monet was a French painter who liked to create landscapes. We have been creating Monet inspired pieces of art using pastels to blend colours together. We have drawn a silhouette of the Houses of Parliament and then used different colours to represent different times of day just like Monet!









In Year 3 we have learnt lots in Maths. First, we were looking at fractions, finding out how many groups we needed from the denominator and then adding together the right number of groups from looking at the numerator. Then we started our next topic of money, we talked about how we can make different denominations of money and we added together how much money we had.







In Year 5 this week, we have been getting involved in Environment day and a Football festival. The children have created junk models, learned how to recycle and how to educate others on the matters that impact the environment.







All the children had a fantastic day during our 'Environment Day' on Thursday. The children learned about pollinators and plants, planted wildflowers and saplings, considered the impact of plastic on the planet's oceans, built hedgehog houses and undertook a junk modelling challenge. They were active, outdoors and in the classroom working together respectfully with smiles on their faces - a superb team! On top of all this, the 'Eco Team' also worked tirelessly to improve the school garden area and set their sights on the next stages of its development! Important Messages



Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a funded school meal, known as the Universal Infant Free School Meal. Northbrook Primary Academy encourages all families entitled to <u>benefits-based Free School Meals</u> to apply. This includes families with children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 as this will ensure not only your child receives delicious healthy meals but also additional school funding that will help us support your children further in school.

Your child may be eligible if you receive any of the following;

- Universal Credit with a household income of less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income-Based Jobseekers' Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, not entitled to Working Tax Credit and household income less than £16,190
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Income Support
- Working Tax Credit 'run on' the payment you receive for a further four weeks after you finish work If you think you are eligible, please visit the following link to apply https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals or pop into the office to complete a form. If you feel you may struggle to complete the application, please call the office and we would be happy to help.
