#### Lunchtimes

As the weather is getting warmer, we are increasingly going playing on the field at lunchtimes. The children, through previous conversations with me had asked for picnic blankets and today, I bought some and shared them with the children.





Thank you to our families that have their children in school on time. Classes which have the highest punctuality now receive an extra playtime!

The Attendance Leader board so far, for this year is:

1st Place - Year 6, 96.4% 2nd Place - Reception, 96.1% 3rd Place - Year 2, 94.9%



Thank you to our families that have their children in school on time. Moving forward, classes which have the highest punctuality will receive an extra playtime the following week! It is a legal requirement that children are in school by 8.55am.

When a child is late, even if only by a few minutes this can cause considerable disruption, not just to their own learning, but to the learning of the rest of the class and impacts on the rewards your child's class can receive each week for 100% punctuality.

'Lost minutes *EQUAL* Lost Learning' just 5 minutes late each day equates to 3 days of school missed each year.



As I have shared previously, all children at Northbrook are in a house team. They are either a Blue Whale, Yellow Lion, Red Panda or a Green Turtle. They are given team points for good work, behaviour or displaying any of our HEART values. Each week the totals from across the school are added together and announced during our Friday Celebration Assembly by our 'Team Captains'.

This half term so far Blue Whales are in the lead!



One of the first questions I was asked when I first started at Northbrook was 'Can we have class names?' After a few meetings with Mrs Wilson and the School Council and listening to the children's voice, we have decided to name our classes after worldwide inspirational people.

We will need 9 of these: Reception, Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5, Y6 (and from September we will have our new SEND Unit and Nursery).

I'd like the people chosen to embody our school and trust values:

- Happiness, Empathy, Aspiration, Respect, Teamwork
- Individuality, Belonging, People Centred, Togetherness, Transformational
