Don't Let Go... Thanks to the work of our Year 5 children, South Ribble Borough Council is encouraging residents to do the right thing and leading by example by banning balloons and sky lanterns on council land and events.



Pupils and teachers from Northbrook Primary Academy attended the council meeting on 21 September to deliver a notice of motion encouraging councillors to back the 'Don't Let Go' campaign which aims to stop harm to wildlife and reduce litter. Councillors supported and approved the motion after Hannah and Abbi gave a persuasive speech to over 50 councillors!

Mrs Adams, Executive Headteacher, Northbrook Primary Academy said: "We are so proud of our children at

Northbrook and the difference they are trying to make in our world. They have done so much reading and research about the changes that can be made to help our environment and they are now being proactive in changing not only the things they do in their own lives but influencing others too. They have produced adverts to persuade others not to use plastic straws because of their effect on the environment, sponsored a polar bear, planted green planet flower bombs, and are developing ideas about planting a wildflower meadow in school."

"Through their research they found out about 'Don't Let Go' which asks local councils to ban the release of balloons and lanterns at their events and they decided to use their excellent persuasion skills to write to South Ribble Borough Council to persuade them to adopt this motion and make a difference here in our local area. They won't stop here...they are already planning to take this motion to other groups to persuade them of the difference they can make."

Acceptable Parental/Adult Behaviour on School Site - As an academy with our children at the heart of what we do, we need to be clear that the following types of behaviour by parents/carers are considered serious and unacceptable and, therefore, will not be tolerated:

- shouting at members of the school staff, parents or children either in person or over the telephone;
- •intimidating a member of staff, parent or child e.g. standing very close to her/him;
- the use of aggressive hand gestures;
- threatening behaviour;
- shaking or holding a fist towards another person;
- using abusive/offensive language
- pushing;
- hitting, e.g. slapping, punching and kicking;

- spitting;
- racist, sexist, homophobic or transgender comments;
- breaching the school's safety and security procedures.

If the negative behaviours are repeated, or where behaviour is extreme, a parent/carer may be banned by the Headteacher, Executive Headteacher or the Local Academy Council from the school premises. Information may also be referred to the Police. We understand that there can be circumstances outside of school that can be very challenging, whether this be within families or between different families. However, these issues must not influence the behaviour of parents or carers on or around school site. There is more than enough space on our school site for the adults to drop off and collect their children without the need for negative interactions. After all, we are the ones that must act as role models to the children within our care.

A few reminders...

- It is impoartant that all children bring a coat to school especially with the weather turning cooler. We will go out for break and lunchtimes even if it is cold and we want all our children to be comfortable whilst out doors!
- We have an increasing amount of 'lost property' school uniform that we are unable to return to children as items have not been labelled with their name. We kindly ask that all parents label their child's clothing (especially jumpers, cardigans, hoodies and coats) so we can get the items back to the correct owner. Thank you!
