


VALUE FOCUS

<u>PINS Survey for Parents and Carers:</u> This survey is part of the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) project, funded by NHS England in partnership with the Department of Education, Department for Health and Social Care and the National Network of Parent Carer Forums (NNPCF).

The survey is open for one week and closing date is 5th June 2024.

The purpose of the project is to improve the experience of mainstream school for children who may have an additional educational need. The information from the survey will be used to understand the current strengths and potential areas of improvement in a school. The survey is for all parents and carers of children attending schools participating in the project. If you have more than one child attend the school, then you may complete the survey for the number of children you have attending the school.
