Arbor Parent App: If you haven't yet activated your Arbor account, please do so as a matter of urgency using the link below. This is now the school's main communication platform. **We no longer use Parent App Connect**.

Go to https://login.arbor.sc and click Forgot your password? to finish setting up your account. Your username is the email address we have stored on our system and you will just need to create a password. Once the account has been created you can download the Parent App from either the 'Play Store' on android phones or the 'Apple

Store' on iPhones. Using the Parent App will allow for swift and cost-free communication through email and push notifications.

It's really important that all parents sign up to Arbor to receive communications from school. Thank you to those parents who have activated their account - 84% of parents have done so far but we need this to be 100%.

If you are having any issues logging on, we have added a help page on our school website <u>Arbor Education | Northbrook Primary Academy</u> to support parents. Please use this page for support in the first instance. If you're still having issues after reviewing this page, please contact the school office.

Years 4, 5, & 6 will have their disco and food from 4:15pm-5:00pm. They will finish school at the usual time of 3:15pm and should return for 4:15pm. Children are to enter and will need to be collected from the main office/reception. All children must be collected by an adult.
