As you know, we have worked hard to ensure all children are in school on time, at 8.55am.

Our gates open at 8.30am, KS1 and KS2 doors are open between 8.45 - 8.55.

Any children that come in after this, must NOW enter school via the office and not the 'Out of school club', as done previously.

Children that are not in school on register closure (9.10) and whose parents have not communicated their absence via Arbor or Mrs Cole on the playground will be contacted via a message on Arbor. If school has not been contacted by 9.30, phone calls will be made by Mrs Ross or Mrs Borg.

The Attendance Leader board so far, for this year is:

1st place - Year 6, 96.5% 2nd Place - Reception, 96% 3rd Place - Year 2, 95%



Thank you to our families that have their children in school on time. Moving forward, classes which have the highest punctuality will receive an extra playtime the following week! It is a legal requirement that children are in school by 8.55am.

When a child is late, even if only by a few minutes this can cause considerable disruption, not just to their own learning, but to the learning of the rest of the class and impacts on the rewards your child's class can receive each week for 100% punctuality.

'Lost minutes **EQUAL** Lost Learning' just 5 minutes late each day equates to 3 days of school missed each year.


