Reception have been making pirate ships linked to their story 'The Night Pirates' by Peter Harris.



Year 1 have been Robot Builders! Last week, our Year 1 children became robot engineers! They followed step-by-step instructions in English to build their very own robots. Next week, they'll be using their writing skills to create a recount of their exciting experience. We can't wait to read all about it!



In year 2 for DT we did some soup tasting and ranked each soup out of 5. We look at what foods we could taste or smell and made a note of them ready to write our own recipe for when we make some soup of our own, in the final week at school.'



Year 3 have had a fantastic experience doing forest school this half term. They have concluded their final session of the year by toasting delicious marshmallows.



Year 4 have been writing their own persuasive radio adverts. The children worked together to create their own products, wrote scripts, complete with slogans and sound effects. They used AI to create an image of their product. The adverts were recorded and put on Seesaw to share with our families. Mrs Prance and Miss Young were both super impressed with the finished products.



In Science, Year 5 have been pollinators!

The children were given a bowl of 'pollen'. As they met other pollinators, they exchanged pollen to explore how quickly and efficiently plants can reproduce with the help of pollinators.



Year 6 walked over to Wellfield last week to complete their science work about the circulatory system and the heart. They were impeccably behaved and brilliantly engaged, as they shared their knowledge and dissected hearts. They looked at the chambers of the heart and the blood flow through the heart they even spotted the 'heart strings'. Thank you to the science department at Wellfield and our fantastic Year 6 pupils for a successful visit.



#### Collaborative work between classes

Miss Quinn and the Reception children were joined by some Year 4 and 2s to work collaboratively in planting flowers in our new planters.

All the flowers were donated by Tesco. The children looked at the parts of the plants, they looked at the labels to see where to plant them and gave them a good water.

We already think they have brightened up the playground and the children have shown lots of interest in learning about flora.



Moving forward we would like to plat these with sensory plants. These would engage and stimulate one or more of our senses: sight, smell, sound, touch, and taste. These plants will offer opportunities to explore colours, textures, scents, soothing sounds, and even edible flavours, making them interesting for out=r children and adults as they pass by. Research has shown that they not only enrich outdoor spaces, they can also help to promote wellbeing.



Thank you to our families that have their children in school on time. Classes which have the highest punctuality will receive an extra playtime the following week! It is a legal requirement that children are in school by 8.55am.

When a child is late, even if only by a few minutes this can cause considerable disruption, not just to their own learning, but to the learning of the rest of the class and impacts on the rewards your child's class can receive each week for 100% punctuality.

'Lost minutes **EQUAL** Lost Learning' just 5 minutes late each day equates to 3 days of school missed each year.

The Attendance Leader board so far, for this year is:

1st place - Year 6, 96.4% 2nd Place - Reception, 95.6% 3rd Place - Year 2, 95.1%

This half term so far Lions are sharing the lead! Our children are given team points for good work, behaviour or displaying any of our HEART values. Each week the totals from across the school are added together and announced during our Friday Celebration Assembly by our 'Team Captains'.
