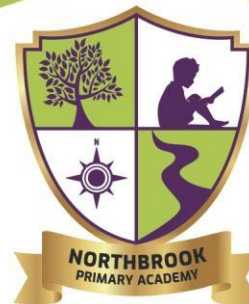


Northbrook Primary Academy - Homework

<u>DT</u> This half term we are going to be creating our very own fabric robin! What can you make out of fabric?	<u>History</u> In History, we are learning all about Florence Nightingale. Can you research some facts about her and present them in a poster?	<u>Fairytales</u> In English this term we are reading fairytales with a twist. Can you write your own fairytale with a twist?
<u>Story setting</u> Think about all the stories you have read. Can you use them to create a story setting for your very own story? You might want to make it out of Lego, paint, colour or even use nature like Andy Goldsworthy.	<u>Materials</u> In Science, we will be looking at materials and their properties. Can you investigate which materials would be best to make some 'gardening gloves'? Think about what properties the materials would need to have. Can you test this?	<u>Your favourite story</u> Read your favourite story with a family member. Then write a book review including how many stars you give it, who the main characters are, what the main events are and why it is your favourite story to read.
<u>Paint a story</u> In English this term we will be looking at traditional stories. Can you use paint to create your own story?	<u>Characters</u> Can you create a model of your favourite character from one of the traditional fairytales we have read?	<u>Christianity</u> In R.E we will be learning about Christianity. We will be looking at why Jesus is 'The Light of the World'. Can you draw an image to show this?
<u>Number hunt</u> In Math's we are looking at addition and subtraction, can you find different numbers around the house and add and subtract them?	<u>Answer the question</u> Why was Florence Nightingale influential? What has changed in hospitals because of her?	<u>Children's choice</u> Have your own homework idea linked to our topic or what we have been learning about. Extra points for creativity.

- Practice your number bonds to 10 and 20.

English Activities

- Write stories.
- Read and spell the words for year 1 and year 2.
- Read 5x a week. Remember to change your book as many times as you want. You can change your library and home reader every morning.
