Thank you to our families that have their children in school on time. Classes which have the highest punctuality will receive an extra playtime the following week! It is a legal requirement that children are in school by 8.55am. When a child is late, even if only by a few minutes this can cause considerable disruption, not just to their own learning, but to the learning of the rest of the class and impacts on the rewards your child's class can receive each week for 100% punctuality. 'Lost minutes EQUAL Lost Learning' just 5 minutes late each day equates to 3 days of school missed each year.
