## World Book Day - Thursday 7<sup>™</sup> March

At Northbrook Primary Academy, we celebrate and promote the love of reading every day and will be dedicating the full day to World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. This is a wonderful day in school where we champion children's reading choices and promote a love of reading.

For our World Book Day celebrations 2024 we will have a whole school focus on the amusing and unusual text 'The Book with No Pictures' written by B. J. Novak. As part of our shared story times, we will celebrate the excitement and pleasure of reading as a school community. This focus will also link to other activities during the school day, including creative activities based around the book's unique style and allowing children to use their own imaginations to create their own nonsense words and characters, making their own books and writing their own stories. Additionally, our Year 6 children will read with their Reception 'buddies', so we build on the fantastic work they have been doing as positive role models for our youngest children.

If there is a particular book that your child enjoys reading at home, we are inviting them to bring that book into school to show class members, so that hopefully our children (or indeed us!) might find a book that they haven't thought about reading and choose to read that book in the future.

We have decided not to run a fancy-dress day as we know this can be expensive for families and can detract from the real focus of the day, which is changing lives through a love of books and shared reading. We will also be hosting a non-uniform day for 'Red Nose Day' on <u>Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March</u> when the children will help us raise money for the various charitable causes.
