I would like to say a big thank you to all the parents and children for making me feel so welcome. We have had a fabulous Autumn term in Year 1, full of learning and fun!

A huge well done to every child who performed in our Nativity. They were all absolutely fantastic, we are incredibly proud of how hard they worked to learn the songs, and we hope you enjoyed watching the performance

Curriculum:

This half term, we are excited to welcome a visiting company who will be teaching the children all about the Great Fire of London which links with our history topic in the summer term.

In English, we will be exploring the stories *Zog* and *The Enormous Turnip*. The children will use these texts to create their own innovated characters and write their own innovated versions of familiar stories.

In Maths, we are currently learning about place value within 20, and later this half term we will move on to place value within 50, as well as length and height, mass and volume, and addition and subtraction.

In Science, we will be learning about *Everyday Materials*, exploring a range of materials and their properties through hands-on investigations. In DT, the children will be designing and creating a house for a book character. In Music, we will be exploring different styles of music, and in Computing, we will be learning how to create simple codes.

Reading:

Reading is a fundamental skill that supports children's success across the curriculum. In Year 1, we are continuing to add to the children's 'reading wands' in class for those who read at least four times a week. Children have access to a wide variety of books in school, but it is especially important that they are reading their phonics books at home to support their progress. Please make sure you are writing in your child's reading diary when you read at home so that we can keep track of this.



PE:


We have PE every Monday and Friday afternoon. It is important that all children have the correct PE kit for both indoor and outdoor sessions, as they cannot take part without it.

At the start of each half term, children should bring their PE kits to school and leave them on their pegs. If you want your child to bring their PE kit home on a more regular basis to be washed, please do so but ensure it is sent back into school for their PE days. PE kits will be used on PE days only, and children will change into and out of their kits at school.

PE kits will be sent home at the end of each half term. If they become dirty during a PE lesson, they may be taken home earlier to be washed and then returned to school.
