Welcome back to what will be your child's final year at Northbrook. This year Mrs Spence will teach Year 6 with Mr Mallon to support us with our learning. The purpose of this newsletter is to outline some of the key information for Year 6 and to find out what we will be doing this half term.



Reading

Reading is an essential part of your child's education here a Northbrook and we have spent time improving our reading offer and you can continue to support this at home.

We expect all children to read at least four times each week. Children will be rewarded for reading at home and for changing their reading book. Children who have read four times a week will receive a raffle ticket for our class raffle to win a reward

Maths

For our Maths lessons, we follow the White Rose Scheme of Learning. We will be starting the Autumn term with a unit on place value, before moving on to addition and subtraction, then multiplication and division.

Within our arithmetic sessions, we will work on written methods and strategies for efficient calculation.

PE

Our PE days are Tuesday and Thursday. Our Thursday session will continue to be led by The Military School and Mrs Spence will teach the Tuesday PE session.

All children need to ensure that their PE kit is in school on these days and we will change in school in separate areas.

Homework

Homework will be set each Thursday and collected and checked the following

Thursday. Mrs Spence will run a lunchtime homework club on Monday to allow children opportunity to receive support with homework if needed. This is voluntary, but is an option as part of our developing independence and initiative taking that children will take responsibility for their homework and seek support. We are looking to offer online homework opportunities, TT rockstars and infinity quizzes, reading and spelling online activities will also be introduced this half term.

Curriculum Overview

In English we will be using Nowhere Emporium as our text and we will be writing our own stories based on this beautifully written story and writing a biography of the main character, explaining his life and 'back story'.

In History, we will be learning about World War One, learning about the start of the war and the reasons why war began. We will look at the propaganda used in World War One and what life was like on The Western Front. In the second half of the term our Geography learning will be based on the Mountains. Our RE learning this term will be based on Christianity and the sacrament of Baptism and Hinduism, exploring the belief of reincarnation. In Art, we will be learning about William Morris and create and use our own printing block. In Science we will continue our learning about Living Things and learn about classification and the significance of scientist Carl Linnaeus.

The partnership between home and school is essential, thank you for your support and if you do have any questions, please ask.


