We understand that all of the children will have had different experiences whilst at home. We know they might not be able to concentrate as well as they used to, that they have got out of some of their routines, that they spend more time playing outside than they do in school, that they may have some anxieties and we will do everything we can to help them with all of that, so don't worry, we know them and we love them and we will do the best for them.


During the next few weeks, up until Easter, our priority is to help them settle back into school and enjoy having their friends around them. We will help them build up their stamina for learning and get back on track, but we will not do that by pushing them too hard, testing them or putting additional pressure on them. We will do it the way we always do, by working alongside them, supporting them and working at their pace. It is not their fault they have missed some time in school and we need to give them some time to adjust. Our staff are very experienced teachers, and good quality teaching will help the children get back on track at the right time and at the right pace. It will happen but we need to give it time.

Over the next few weeks, don't worry if they say they have spent more time outside than usual, because that will be helping them reform friendships, learn to work together and give them some brain breaks. Much of our learning may move outdoors as the weather improves as this also helps reduce our risk.

Free School Meals (Pupil Premium)

Just a reminder that in addition to all infant children (Reception to Y2) being eligible for Universal Free School Meals, all children from **Nursery to Year 6** may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit





In addition to your child receiving free school meals, schools receive valuable funding of £1,345 per pupil to help improve progress for children who may need it. You can apply to check your eligibility at any time, as understandably, family circumstances may change, especially in the current uncertain times we are facing.

Start and finish times


The following is our entrance and exit procedures for children in reception, year 1 and year 2. All of the children in these year groups should enter through the infant gate, which is the gate which leads onto Headley Road.

The following is our entrance and exit procedure for children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6. All of the children in these year groups should enter through the Bannister Drive gate.

Please only come at the specified time and do not congregate at the gates if you arrive early. Please move through as quickly as possible to avoid any bottlenecks.

Collection: Collect from the usual playground area, **PLEASE USE THE WHOLE YARD TO DISTANCE**, **DO NOT GATHER ROUND THE GATE**.

If you have siblings in different classes, drop off is at the earliest time for your family and collect at the later time. E.g. a family with children in year 1, 3 & 6 would drop off at 8:45 (y6 drop off time) and collect at 3:15 (y6 collection time)
