### Dear Parents/Carers,

**Choosing** the **right primary school** can set your child up with a **lifelong love of learning**. Over the weekend the Hartlepool Mail published **'The 21 top primary schools in the North East, according to Ofsted and league tables'**. We are delighted that Oakdene was ranked **11th in the whole of the North East and** ranked in **1st place** for the **best primary school** in Stockton On Tees!

Last week we hosted members of the **Academy Improvement Committee** and a number of **leaders/serving inspectors** from the North and East hubs of the Enquire Learning Trust. They could see how our **outstanding curriculum** is meticulously planned to ensure we provide the **winning formula** of the precision of literacy and numeracy skills with **memorable**, exciting and challenging learning opportunities.

Year 6 enjoyed two sessions delivered by **Children Challenging Industry** prior to their site visits. 6B tested the best materials for medicines, such as the right amount of glycerine, linked to their visit to Fujifilm. 6M tested cooling hot water down as quickly as possible, linked to their visit to Micropore, who make different emulsifiers.

6B visited **Fuji Film in Billingham** they had a tour of the building and moved around four different activities which demonstrated how they test the **viscosity of liquids**, how they create carbon dioxide in medicines using yeast and sugar and how they mix liquids. Y6B had a race to see how fast they could put on the **safety equipment** of goggles, overalls and gloves. All children received a gift bag with a water bottle, seeds and passports linked to careers and activity books.

6M visited **Micropore, Redcar** where they worked alongside two engineers. They created their own version of hydrogel tablets by adding two substances together to **create a porous structure around a fluid.** This is used when creating different medicines, where the outer shell encases the inner fluid before it would be released. Following this, 6M looked at how to **create an emulsifier** by adding oil and water together. Next they shook the substances to see if they could create an emulsifier as well as the machine. Some of the children came very close.
