



Month of Pride Throughout June, Oakdene Primary Academy will once again celebrate **Pride Month.** Pride Month runs from 1st - 30th June, and is celebrated in honour of the Stonewall Riots (though Pride events occur all year round). Gay pride, or LGBT+ pride, is the **positive stance against discrimination** and violence toward lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT+) people to promote their self-affirmation, dignity, equality rights, increase their visibility as a social group, build community and celebrate sexual diversity and gender variance.

We will continue to look at different **relationships** in our lessons and assemblies (in an age appropriate way) as well as promoting **inspirational** figures from the LGBTQ+ community.
