It was **National Storytelling Week** last week; this takes place every year and is a celebration of the **power of sharing stories**. Stories **teach** us about the world, they allow us to step into someone else's shoes and feel **empathy**, they help us to **relax and escape** and they can help develop **essential literacy skills**. We are a 'reading' school and love being hooked into a book at Oakdene.

Have you ever wondered why your child can be grumpy when they have been on their computer, tablet or phone for long periods of time? As an adult, I know that I get headaches, feel tired and sometimes feel less energetic if I have been on screens for a long time. This week, schools across England will be participating in **Safer Internet Day**. As part of our safer internet discussions this week, we will be talking about the right **balance of screen time** for our **mental health** and **wellbeing**. Research shows that too much screen time affects children both physically and mentally resulting in problems including obesity, mental health issues, behaviour issues and anger and lethargy. In school, we will be participating in assemblies and lessons around how too much screen time can affect our mental health.

Children's Mental Health Week 2023 will also take place this week, from 6-12 February 2023. This year's theme is Let's Connect. Let's Connect is about making meaningful connections for all, during Children's Mental Health Week – and beyond. For Children's Mental Health Week 2023, we're encouraging people to connect with others in healthy, rewarding, and meaningful ways. There is a great website www.place2be.org.uk -run by the charity Place2Be which contains a range of free resources. This includes a section for parents and carers containing stories and tips for both adults and children.
