




What an exciting year we have ahead of us - we can't wait to see what we can achieve together.

Support and guidance on attendance is always available and if you have any questions about this, or if you need help to achieve an improvement, then please contact us to discuss this. Attendance - Holiday Request Reminder Parents and Carers are required under the Education Act (1996) to ensure Children attend school regularly. The Principal of a school has a discretionary power to authorise absence only in exceptional circumstances.

A family holiday is not an exceptional

circumstance. Family holidays in term time are not allowed in law and are very unlikely to be authorised. Taking children on leave without applying for authorisation may mean the school has to report your child as 'missing' to the local authority and holidays cannot be authorised retrospectively in law. The direct correlation between attendance and attainment is undeniable. Absence from school interrupts teaching and learning and compromises progress. It creates further anxiety and children may struggle maintaining friendships.

The government has made changes to the law relating to school attendance. **Penalty** notices have **increased** and there is now an **escalation** process for repeated offences which includes **prosecution or other legal interventions.**

Support and guidance is always available from school if you have any questions about attendance or if you need help to achieve an improvement.

Milk and Fruit

Children in Nursery, Reception, Y1 and Y2 receive free fruit each day. This is funded nationally. Children under 5 receive free milk. School funds this for all reception children even once they turn 5 as we feel this is really important to stay healthy.

Children in KS2 may bring in their own healthy snacks for break times (fresh or dried fruit/vegetables).

Please ensure your child continues to bring a water bottle filled with water only each day and this stays in their Classroom. If they have a packed lunch, please add a separate drink into their packed lunches which stays in the dining hall.
