Years 3 and 4 were thrilled to welcome Gabrielle Kent, a inspiring author from the North East, for a special visit! Gabrielle shared her varied career journey as a writer and spoke openly about living with ADHD, showing the children how creativity and perseverance can lead to amazing achievements. Her career began as a video-game artist working on titles for PC, PlayStation, and Xbox, before spending sixteen years as a university lecturer teaching students how to make games and hosting major games and animation festivals. She answered lots of curious questions and sparked ideas for our budding young writers. The children left feeling motivated and full of creative energy—what an incredible experience!









Y3 pupils enjoyed spending the day as Vikings in a replica Viking settlement based on the outskirts of York. The unique educational environment formed part of the history curriculum on their study of Invaders and Settlers. Danelaw Dark Age Village contains a number of houses, workshops and fields, offering an atmospheric and hands-on learning environment. During the course of the day, the Y3s were **farmers**, hoeing the field and craftsmen, making clay oil lamps. Children dressed up in period-costumes and carried out a range of activities. They performed household tasks that involved collecting firewood and grinding wheat to make bread. Guard training was given to help the new settlers protect the village from marauding Saxons.


