## Dear Parents/Carers,

Last week we were delighted to be able to share the **final inspection report** with you. The report will be uploaded onto the Ofsted website later this week. We continue to be an **OUTSTANDING** school. Only 17% of 370 "outstanding" schools kept their grade when they had a full reinspection in 2021-22.

As our CEO shared in a letter accompanying the report: "When Oakdene was inspected in March 2013 it was labelled as outstanding. In the decade that has passed, the inspection process has changed significantly and the bar for an outstanding judgement has been set at a much higher level. In a very real sense the report that has been published today represents a significant and sustained improvement over ten years." Thank you so much for the wonderful messages congratulating our team, the wonderful cards and the doughnut deliveries.

Ofsted reports are now much slimmer. 700 words can't reflect the detailed verbal feedback we heard at the Team meetings at the end of each day of the inspection. What the report doesn't share is that we had a significant restructure and a **considerable change** in staffing for the academic year 2022-23: with a **new Vice Principal** role created (recruited internally), recruited a new **EY/KS1** and a **KS2 Leader** (internally) plus **4 Early Career Teachers** who had been TAs and followed the SCITT (school centred route into teaching). This created **4 new TA** appointments and we appointed another ECT in Sept '23. Very few teachers based in classrooms had experienced Ofsted. We are very much like a new team. Four out of five ECTs have led a subject since September '23 they are **fledgling leaders**. Three of them were invited to be in the spotlight when inspectors looked at foundation stage subjects. They really rose to the occasion.

There was an **additional HMI inspector** who isn't named on the report as she was quality assuring the process. Most schools our size have one or two inspectors. This is the most intense inspection we have endured. **We are exceptionally proud of our entire team.** So much of the inspection relies on the children. Inspectors shared how the children 'beamed with pride' as they talked about every aspect of school life. Once again we'd like to say a **huge thank you** to the children who were truly **remarkable**.

Despite receiving such a **glowing report**, we still have lots of exciting developments and are always looking to improve even further - we never rest on our laurels here at Oakdene!

A huge thank you to all parents and carers for showing how creative you can be! Many took inspiration from key texts and authors used in school. All classes enjoyed fun and engaging activities, and a fabulous World Book Day special **assembly** led by Mrs Osborne and our librarians.

All children from our 2yr olds up to Y6 received a **£1 Book Token** as usual, however, last year pupil voice revealed that many children previously rarely exchanged their voucher for a book. So once again, we used **Pupil Premium funding (10p per book)** to ensure that <u>every child</u> received one of the **World Book Day £1 books** that were chosen for each phase of the school by our librarians and kindly organised by **Drake Independent Book Shop in Stockton**. The librarians helped Mrs Osborne collect the delivery.

Richard Drake welcomed some of our dedicated librarians into the beautiful bookstore which is hidden away in **26-27 Silver Street, Stockton On Tees.** Next time you are in town, pop in for a browse and a coffee. The librarians diligently **sorted new books alphabetically** by surname, created new **displays** and served some familiar customers in their role as **'guest booksellers'**. They were generously rewarded with a book of their choice. Richard very kindly invited them to access the store room and **select resources** to further enhance our library areas at school.

Children in **reception** joined a **live virtual event with author** and illustrator **Raahat Kaduji** for a gentle **storytime** and **draw-along** session inspired by her latest book, I'm Not Sleepy! **KS1** were immersed into a **magical tales** and drawing workshop with popular children's illustrator **Axel Scheffler. Y3** joined Nina Peanut creator **Sarah Bowie** to meet some of the characters and even learn how to draw them! **Y4, Y5** & **Y6** participated in a Live Virtual event **'The Great Big Footy & Booky Quiz'**.

The **Readathon** created a real buzz around school and raised an incredible **£995.00** to support children in local hospitals. We were overwhelmed with the **generosity** of family members despite challenging times with rising food and energy costs. You are **AMAZING!** 



Each week **Madame Sonle**y (specialist language teacher) teaches languages to all KS2 pupils. The Y3 pupils practised their new vocabulary during a **French Day** at school. Once the chicks were dry, we moved them into the **brooder cage**. By Friday, we had 6 very fluffy and **healthy** chicks. At first, the chicks loved being handled but as they grew, they preferred to run around, **flapping their wings**! YR had a class **vote** and decided to name them Sunshine, Midnight, Mango, Cookie, Trixie, and Baby.



Two very special visitors were welcomed into the reception classroom in preparation for their farm visit—two lambs, **Flossy** and **Cotton**! Flossy, was 10 days old and Cotton was just 2 days old. We asked Mrs Jackson lots of interesting questions, such as, "What do they eat?" and "How big will they grow?" Mrs Jackson then kindly agreed to take the lambs on a tour of the whole school to meet all of the children.



Last week we held another exciting **Open Morning** for the Parents & Carers of Y2 pupils. The activities linked to some special bears from around the world and **STEAM** (Science, Technology, **Engineering, the Arts and Maths**). They included: Science (& food technology) & mathematics) following a Scottish recipe & weighing ingredients to make Cranachan.
