#### Dear Parents/Carers,

The term started for staff on Thursday, 1st September where we spent two days focusing on our Academy Improvement Plan and looking back and **celebrating our successes** from the previous year. We also spent time focusing on safeguarding, GDPR and personal development. It was also a great opportunity to welcome all of our new members of staff joining our Oakdene family. We have also had lots of work completed in school during the summer break to ensure the children have the best possible setting for them to learn and flourish. We haven't had any vandalism for a number of years and it was disappointing to find damage and theft of outdoor resources including that two of our willow panels had been lifted and burnt on a nearby field.

It has been really fantastic to welcome the children back to school. Seeing happy and excited parents/ carers and children walking through the gates was a wonderful experience. As I walked around school each day, it was brilliant to see our children **actively engaged in their learning** and generally delighted to be back to business. These offer incentives on a weekly, termly and, of course, the chance to win £50 for 100% attendance for the whole school year.

We have ended the week with the sad news of the death of our Queen who has led us through the Elizabethan Age with remarkable service, an incredible dedication to duty, a source of stability and reassurance - an inspiration to us all. May she rest in peace. Class teachers spent time supporting and answering poignant questions posed by your amazing children. Staff were struck at how much comfort the children had been given in knowing they had joined the nation in thanking the Queen during most recent Platinum Jubilee celebrations. At the start of this week, Oakdene will come together with the rest of our nation as the mourning period continues, reflecting upon the long reign and life of one of the world's most iconic figures. Whilst observing the national mourning period, we will continue to support our pupils, families and staff.



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

#### Attendance - September

Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza, has produced a new report. In the report, Back into school: New insights into school absence, she highlights the importance of the return to school as "critical" for "getting pupils into school and settled into the school routine".

This attendance ladder is a clear visual aid which demonstrates that every day in school really does count.



#### Attendance - Holiday Request Reminder

Parents and carers are required under the Education Act (1996) to ensure children attend school regularly. The Principal of a school has a discretionary power to authorise absence only in exceptional circumstances. A family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

If you complete a leave of absence request form and the request is declined, (as it will be in the majority of Cases) and you still take your child out of school, each parent within your household will be issued with a £60 penalty notice for each child you have taken out of school.

If a penalty notice remains unpaid after 21 days it will increase to £120. If after 28 days it remains unpaid you may be summoned to appear before Magistrates to explain why your child has unauthorised school absences and you may be liable for a fine of up to £1000.

Support and guidance on attendance is always available and if you have any questions about this, or if you need help to achieve an improvement, then please contact us to discuss this.

For the academic year 2023-2024 (May 2024) onwards it has been agreed by Trustees that Oakdene will have two weeks break at May Half Term and a shorter summer break.

#### **Oakdene Primary Academy**

#### **Changes to Term Dates Summer 2024**



Oakdene Primary Academy is always looking for ways to make the best use of learning time, as well as supporting our families the best we can. We propose to extend the half term holiday in May to two weeks and shorten the length of the summer holiday.

#### There would be many benefits to this:

- Holidays (both abroad and in the UK) will be significantly cheaper than in term time.
   By offering a two-week window in May, parents, carers (and staff) can book holidays at a cheaper rate therefore reducing absenteeism.
- Parents and carers often comment to us about the reduced prices for many activities when it is term time. For example, we know some of them take advantage of reduced prices.
- Possible reduction in fixed penalty notices.
- Families who can afford holidays in the summer break are finding that, as a result of climate change, temperatures in Europe are too hot for young children and are still opting to take a two week break during May/June. This solution would reduce absenteeism and allow families to book holidays in cooler months.
- The proposed timings would even out the length of terms; spring term is very short and summer term is very long. This would be a huge benefit for learning.
- The long summer term is very busy and tiring for children; this can impact on the learning.
- Possible reduction in referrals during the summer holidays. Data over time suggests
  that our vulnerable children are more likely to be exposed to harm at the end of the
  summer holidays.
- Childcare during the summer holidays will be easier for working parents and carers to manage.
- The financial strain of feeding children during the holiday period will be reduced by a week.
- All children would benefit from a shorter summer holiday. They will still have the opportunity to return to school well rested but this will reduce the loss of learning.

Our proposal was accepted by Trustees in July 2022. **This new arrangement will not take effect this academic year.** It will be implemented in the next academic year 2023-2024.

This will mean May Half Term will be from **Monday, 27**<sup>th</sup> **May** <u>2024</u> until **Friday, 7**<sup>th</sup> **June 2024.** 

Instead of breaking for summer on Tuesday, 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2024 we will break up on Tuesday, 30<sup>th</sup> July 2024.
